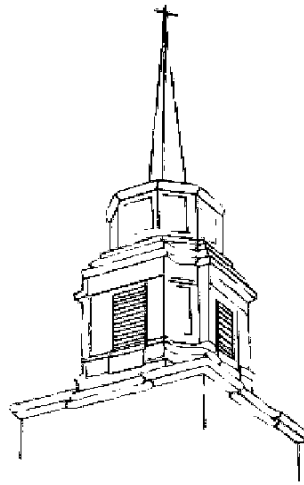

Dear Friends in the Lord,

The Season of Lent is quickly approaching. Ash Wednesday is February 17<sup>th</sup> – two weeks from this Wednesday. To avoid overcrowding we will have Masses at 9:15 a.m., 12:15 and 6:15 p.m. The following was released from the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments in Rome on January 12, 2021:

### ***NOTE ON ASH WEDNESDAY Distribution of Ashes in Time of Pandemic***

*The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return".*

*The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything.*

So much is different in this Time of Pandemic. The distribution of ashes included. Nonetheless, as with the communion line, this form of distribution is conducive to a deep reverence. In fact, it is good to be reminded that the ritual was not established so people could see a cross on our foreheads. This year we can begin our great penitential season with our heads bowed and humbly admitting our need for God's mercy.

This Lent will also include the 98<sup>th</sup> Annual Novena of Grace in Honor of St. Francis Xavier – also known as the Lenten Retreat of the Diocese of Worcester. As always, it will be held from March 4<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>. Obviously, we need to ensure everyone's safety. To that end, a reservation will be needed to guarantee a seat. You can make a reservation through the parish website or by calling the rectory office. The weekend of the Novena is March 6 and 7 and, even if you are not making the Novena, you will need to reserve a seat for the weekend Mass you wish to attend. We will not announce the sign-up requirement outside of the parish for another week. This will allow St. John's members to be the first to make a reservation.

### COLLECTION FOR PRIESTS' RETIREMENT -

This year on Ash Wednesday the parishes of our diocese will begin an annual collection to support the retirement needs of our diocesan priests. In 2019 a committee appointed by Bishop McManus examined the suitability and sustainability of retirement benefits for our retired diocesan priests. The annual health insurance and housing costs along with monthly stipends for our retired priests have recently been running from \$2.2 - \$2.6 million. Even with revenue from Celebrate Priesthood, Partners in Charity, the Legacy of Hope Capital Campaign, the endowments from the Forward in Faith Capital Campaign, parish assessments, and other restricted funds and donations, the costs of caring for our 50+ retired priests exceeds our revenue, in 2020 by \$266,810. After reviewing the committee's report and receiving input from the priests of our diocese, Bishop McManus is instituting an annual Ash Wednesday Collection for Priest Retirement as one part of the diocese's renewed efforts to care for our retired priests. Please consider a donation to the Ash Wednesday Collection to support those who have given their lives in service to the people of the Diocese of Worcester. ### BIBLE-IN-A-YEAR PROGRAM & LENTEN

**STUDY-** The Immaculate Conception Center, in partnership with St. John's, is offering two upcoming faith formation programs. ### DEPT. OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES SEEKING SPACES FOR MONITORED

**CHILD VISITS-** The MA Dept. of Children and Families (DCF) is looking for space with a separate entrance where children, who are placed out of home, can have a supervised family visit. These would be monitored by DCF staff and could include others such as interpreters. The space would need to accommodate 6 ft. social distancing for between 4 and 10 people with tables and chairs. They would like to have access on at least one day per week with 2 visits in the a.m. and 2 visits in the afternoon. They would also need dedicated restrooms and help disinfecting between the sessions. They use screening questions and provide PPE for all visits. They can provide proper signage. The visits are staggered so one group does not interact with another.
