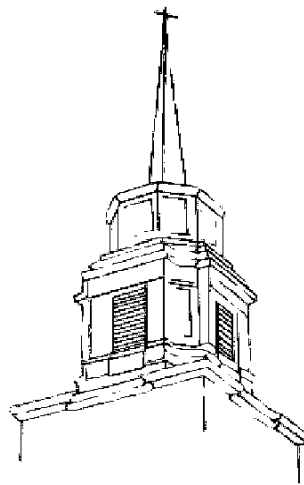

Dear Friends in the Lord,

This message should rightly begin, "As I have said before." The truth is that, by this time in our relationship, I have already said everything I know or have thought. Since it would be redundant to acknowledge every time that I am repeating myself, let's just presume that I am. So...

One of my favorite aspects of the Old Testament is how God (YHWH) is sometimes presented as learning on the job. The obvious truth is that it is the people who learn about God and not the other way around. Still, this literary style speaks to an intimacy that must be present in their relationship for the Biblical authors to write in the way they do. Interestingly, today's first reading presents the first thing that God "learns."

As you know, the Old Testament begins, with the Book of Genesis and the Story of Creation. Out of nothing and only through divine love, this glorious creation came to be. We are told that *God looked at everything he had made and found it very good*. But, evidently, not perfect. For soon we hear the first lesson God learns, *it is not good for the man to be alone*. Not surprisingly, God learns well: *This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh*.

The Little Rock Catholic Study Bible reflects, *the man recognizes an affinity with the woman God brought him*. Unlike the animals who were made from the ground, she is made from his very self. This is a lesson which has taken us humans a long time to learn. Indeed, we are continuing to learn about the close relationship God created between man and woman, not a hierarchical union, but as partners, supporting and nurturing each other.

It is clear to us all, I am sure, that this lesson needs to be learned more deeply and practiced more readily in our time. This is true for all our relationships and not only in marriage. In this age of division and alienation, expanding our vision to see that we are all made of the same stuff is critical to achieving the true community God has intended for us.
