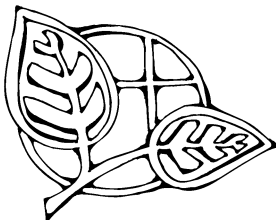

1. Adults and students invited by Badger to presentations by Bob Noel from our diocese on Oct. 30. Middle School Rally at TRF on Oct. 17. RAYL event at RHS on Wed. Oct. 9 for Gr. 7-12.
2. Confirmation on Sat. Oct. 12 - Catechists lined up for all classes.
3. Adult Formation opportunities - Study on Acts (Mon. eve) and reflections on upcoming Sunday rdgs. Before 10:30 Mass (9:30).
4. Working on brief demo of FORMED and website to be done at Mass soon.
5. RE: best times to have a speaker at the parish -- during meal after Mass, Wed. evening or Sunday evening.
6. Convocation for parish leaders at Crox -- seven from our tri-parish attended -- V. good -- videos purchased on stories of faith in action for our three parishes. Several members were unable to attend. We discussed and worked on the following items.

1. Almost all shared how the Lord had connected them with people needing spiritual and other support in recent times. We may work on larger outreach and renewal efforts but it still comes down to ministering and relating to one person at a time.
2. Took time to reflect on what was most helpful and inspiring to us at the EGF convocation -- the videos, the witness of the panel sharing their efforts to reach out to others, bishop's teaching on the history of renewal going on in the Church,
3. Talked about responses we might make in our parishes such as lifting up those who are witnesses of faith in our communities and asking people to share how their witness has touched them or others. -- Will look into the new program -- "The 99".
4. Videos were purchased Julie and will come in November. Talked about when and how to share them. Short films might be shown after Mass. We could have a monthly movie night in our parishes. Difficult to find an ideal time. Movies are an effective way for people to encounter Christ.

Catholic Considerations for Our Earthly Passing

We prepare for eternal life by choosing to love and follow God. Our journey with Christ includes equipping our consciences to make morally good judgements at the end of life. While no summary can substitute for thorough catechesis, one thing is clear: we are entrusted by God with the gift of life. This obliges us to make use of appropriate, effective medical care. The Church affirms the inviolable dignity of every person, regardless of the duration or extent of the person's incapacity. Nothing diminishes the sanctity of a person's life, or the obligation to protect and care for it. Those who are sick should not be alone, and, even after death, accompaniment continues by praying for those who have passed.

When you hear the word "addiction", what typically comes to mind? Needles? Alcohol? Pills? As Jim Owens, MA, LPC explains, addiction is much simpler, including everything from substances to technology, screen time, work, shopping, and even sugar. Addictions and distractions are used to manage pain—but in the process, end up damaging our brains, our relationships, and our ability to find lasting happiness.
