BRISTOL FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

Much to be Thankful for: Sometimes we forget to share some of the highlights quick enough. The Drive-Thru Food Donation Drive that happened May 9th was a huge success countywide! As a whole we took in over 20,000lbs of food and about 80k dollars (for all pantries involved. Bristol's share of the finances was over \$7,000. We also took in just under 2,000lbs of food. Thank you for so many who helped make this possible through promotion, volunteering, and donating!!

Current pantry needs and what has been happening:

Our community and partner churches continue to supply a lot of food and financial donations during this time. We are well stocked in a number of items -- a few we could still use are crackers, grape jelly, granola bars, and diapers/ baby wipes. We are deeply, deeply thankful for your support!!

Procedures for June: Modified procedures continue for all those coming in for assistance. Food is pre-packaged according to the family sizes that we serve, and boxes are taken out to families after we check them in at the door. Minimal Volunteer staff are the only people inside the building. Our Volunteers wash their hand regularly, use hand sanitizer, and wear masks. The carts are wiped down after each use. As we have been doing --we ask all volunteers 70 and above to stay at home at this time.

BLESSED SOLANUS: CANOE THE WABASH

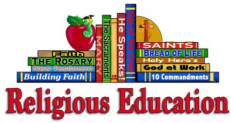
