New Procedures Dealing with Coronavirus

As announced at last weekend's Masses, new procedures are now in place to deal with the Coronavirus situation.

Following are the new procedures:

1. We ask that you kindly disinfect your hands when entering the church or going to the parish office. New hand sanitizer dispensers have been placed by the entrance lobby doors to the church and outside the parish office.
2. The holy water containers (little fonts by each door) have been removed to ensure there is no contamination.
3. The Sign of peace during Mass is suspended.
4. **Everyone is encouraged to receive Communion by hand only at this time.** Please ensure that your hand is flat when receiving the host and consume it in the presence of the priest or minister of Communion.
5. If you are sick or unwell, you should stay home until you are fully recuperated. Sunday obligation does not bind those who are ill.
