To show the "far away" the joy of living our lives in Christ, strengthened by the Sacramental graces made available to us by the ministry of the Church He founded and entrusted to the protection of Holy Spirit.

Each of us, fortified in our 4th day by our Group reunions and Ultreya, should courageously befriend those within our environments (that moveable square meter), who are questioning their faith or the need for the churches ministry. Meet them where they are and share with them the good news that God, in Christ loves them.

Lisa and I enjoyed the 2018 National Encounter that was held back in August at Seattle University. It was a wonderful event with around 700 Cursillistas attending from all over the USA. The

theme of the encounter was 'Unity in Diversity'. The concept that stuck with me from the keynote address was that God made us diverse, from many places and with differing life experiences but we are all to be united in the Body of Christ.
