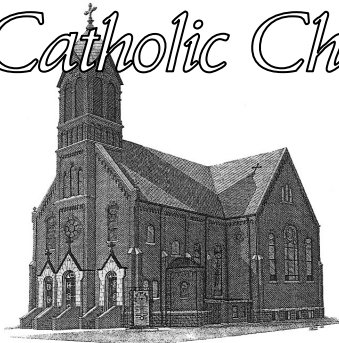
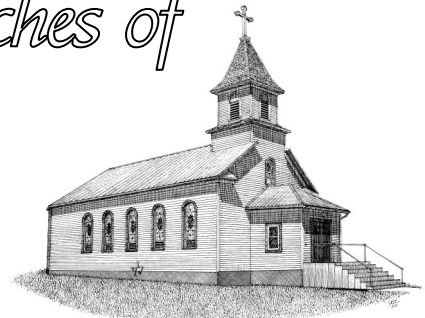

Mass for Deceased Clergy: The public is invited to attend the annual Mass for Deceased Bishops, Priests and Deacons celebrated by Bishop Kagan on Tuesday, November 3rd at 11 a.m. at the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit in Bismarck. This Mass honors members of the clergy who have passed away in the previous year. This year, we remember in our prayers: Deacon Ray Jilek (3-16-20), Brother Llewelyn Kouba (3-22-20) and Deacon John Tharladsen (7-14-20).

The Strasburg & Hague CCD Program are again participating in the OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD PROJECT which consist of filling and delivering gift filled shoe boxes which are shipped across seas to over 150 countries. This project has reached 11 million children who are less fortunate *AND* some who have never received a gift or this may be the only gift they receive this year. If you chose to participate in this project please send items with your child/students to CCD or drop off at the Strasburg rectory by **November 11th** to be placed in a shoe box. If you have extra shoe boxes we could use those too or plastic boxes with a lid about the size of a shoe box. It costs \$9.00 to send each box so if you care to donate to help with shipping that would be helpful as well. Ideas to fill a shoe box are: Flashlights with batteries as many don't have electricity; Jump rope; Slinky; Small stuffed animals; Small balls; Toy cars; Bar soap; Colored pencils, markers, pens, pencils, or erasers; Stickers; Solar calculators; Small kite; Yo Yo's or other safe toys; Stick form deodorant; Nail clippers/files; T-shirts; socks; Play dough; Comb/brush/ hair ties or clips; Wash cloths; Flip flops; Coloring books/crayons; Toothbrush; Sunglasses; Band-aids; Small blankets; Harmonica; Caps/Hats; Picture books, small dolls; and Little games. Items to **AVOID** are nonperishable items like chocolate, candy; gum, toothpaste, fruit snacks, knife or gun toys, liquids, lotions, glass items or anything that would break easily, or anything that would melt.
