





files; T-shirts; socks; Play dough; Comb/brush hair ties or clips; Wash cloths; Flip flops; Coloring books/crayons; Toothbrush; Sunglasses; Band-aids; Small blankets; Harmonica; Caps/Hats; Picture books, small dolls; and Little games. Items to **AVOID** are nonperishable items like chocolate, candy; gum, toothpaste, fruit snacks, knife or gun toys, liquids, lotions, glass items or anything that would break easily, or anything that would melt. 
