

SUPPLY LIST: GRADE 8

All students should have the following materials to be properly prepared for class:

THREE BLUE BALL POINT PENS (Felt tip, clicking and liquid gel pens are not permitted!)

Two **RED** ball point pens (e.g. *Bic* or *Papermate*) for correcting work in class

***A MINIMUM OF THREE SHARPENED #2 PENCILS** with erasers for math.

***Pencil sharpeners should be left at home!**

A 12-inch ruler, a protractor, and an inexpensive *scientific* calculator

*****All of the above items should be stored in a pencil case.***

11 Large Composition Notebooks for math (2), language arts (1), social studies (1), science (2), religion (2), Spanish (1), Computer (1) and literature (1) (**Spiral notebooks are prohibited!**)

*****Social studies, science, and math notes must be kept in separate notebooks! Grade 8 students must check with your teacher to find out how they want their respective notebooks organized! Students will be responsible for providing their own tissues!***

One solid eight-pocket folder with compartments to store graded compositions and composition worksheets, various worksheets assigned in math, language arts, social studies, science, and literature. It is also strongly suggested that the student keep **ONE FOLDER FOR STORING COMPLETED HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS AND TESTS OR NOTICES THAT MUST BE TURNED IN THE FOLLOWING DAY**. This will prevent the panic that results when randomly placed assignments cannot be found!

WIDE-RULED THEME PAPER: This paper is for homework and quizzes! No homework or quiz paper will be accepted if it is torn from the notebooks! This paper clutters the floor and destroys notebooks!

To review for the TACHS test, it is recommended that the eighth grade students obtain a copy of the *Kaplan Catholic High School Entrance Exams (COOP – HSPT – TACHS)*. **For the best results, it would be wise for the students to break up this assignment over the summer. Although we will do an intensive review before the TACHS test, it would be beneficial if students can identify specific areas that they may wish the teachers to address!**
