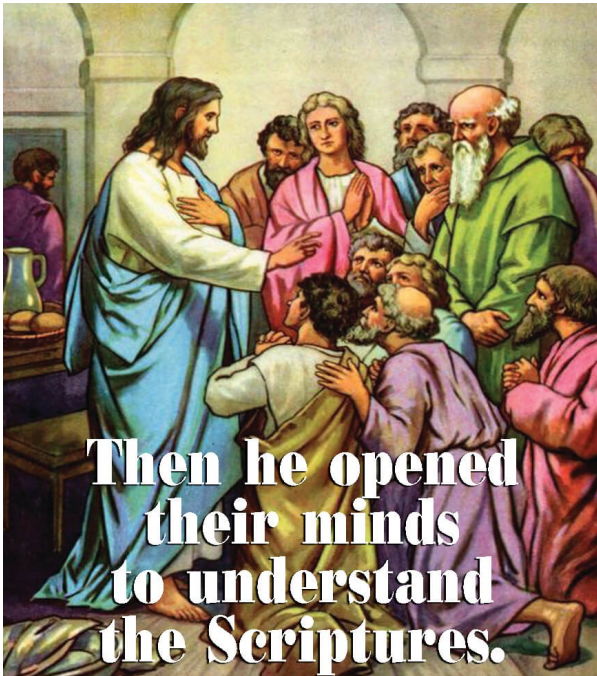

FROM FATHER MIKE

There is story I ran across about obstetrician Stéphane Tarnier, who in the 1870s saw the death of two out of three babies born with low birth weight. Exhausted from living with so many losses, Tarnier took a day and visited the zoo. He wandered into an exhibit of baby chickens and saw an incubator in use. Soon he had a similar machine built for human babies, and the mortality rate was halved. For me the important aspect of this story was that he stepped away from his normal routine, and in doing so gained insight into how better to live his life. Today's gospel is a story of Eucharist, as Jesus is recognized by his disciples in the breaking of the bread and then Christ opens their minds to understand the scriptures. Perhaps Sunday Mass for some Catholics is seen as a weekly drudgery, and for others as an ideal religious practice that can be attended when it fits into the weekend schedule. For me, it is an essential respite from the world that puts us into direct contact with the Risen Lord. Beyond giving us insight, it is itself an incubator that it gives us the experience of God's love that warms us, protects us, heals us, and gets us ready to live our life back out in the world.

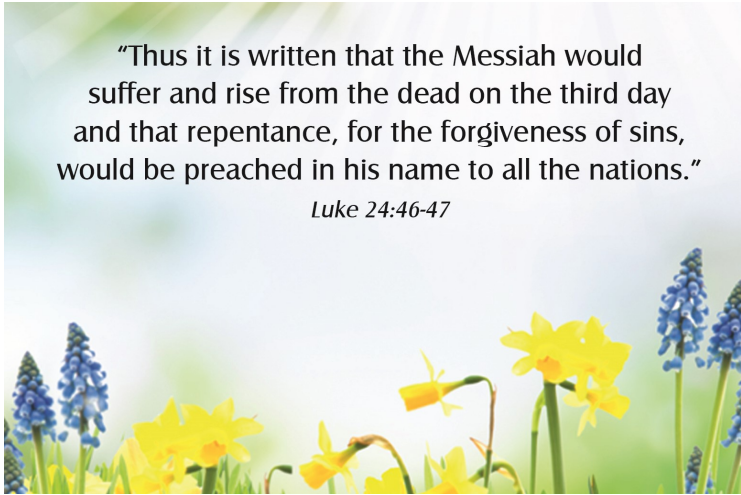
