From Father Mike

This weekend is the last Sunday of the church liturgical calendar, when we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. Kingly authority in the time of Jesus and throughout human history is usually one where power is exerted by someone in order to control a group of people for that same person's benefit. But for those who follow Christ as their king, we recognize that Jesus used his power to serve instead of dominate, to give instead of to take, and to save us no matter what the cost. Believing in Jesus as king also means making his value system our own, where we make our relationship with God and our service of others the focal point of our lives. One of the ways we practically live this out is in using our time to give Christ honor and glory in our regular participation in the Mass, both on Sunday and other special occasions that connect us to him. As Catholics, we believe our relationship with Jesus is best lived out with a corresponding devotion to his mother, Mary, who could not have brought the Messiah of mankind into the world without herself being free from sin. Not only is our celebration of Mary's Immaculate Conception important for Catholics because it recognizes Christ's divinity while being fully human but because she is the patron saint of the United States. Yes, this is an early alert to the Holy Day of Obligation on Saturday, December 8, not only because many Catholics are not making this extra Mass a priority but also due to the missed opportunity to honor our king's mother and experience her care for us as her beloved children.

INCLEMENT WEATHER
