Although we are in Cycle C of the three year cycle of readings, we begin Ordinary Time in this cycle with a reading from the second chapter of the Gospel of John. The story, commonly entitled “The Wedding at Cana,” is about the beginning of Jesus’ ministry. The narrative is something we could imagine could happen today—a couple is getting married, the party is in full swing, and the wine is flowing freely. If you think about it, there are few celebrations more important and fun in the life of a family than the marriage of a couple. The interesting plot twist in this story is the unusual event of bringing better tasting wine later at the reception, when those who are still drinking are probably not as discerning about the taste of the wine. Our spiritual life with God has a similar progression because, as exciting and wonderful things are at the beginning of a relationship, they actually get better over time, where there is even more closeness and love. While not a straight line of improvement, we should expect things to improve in our life with Jesus in the long term. For married persons of faith, this is experienced in how their marriage develops a stronger bond over the years, even though all couples go through their tough times and growing pains. In a culture that is uncertain of the value of commitment, I would encourage all couples to be bold in constantly sharing with others the gift of marriage as one example of how God’s love is great today and even better tomorrow.
