## From Father Mike

Last week I talked about the process of discernment that led to the change in assignments for the priests. This week I would like to continue to tell you why I believe the *Uniting in Heart 2030 Pastoral Plan* is truly a gift for our diocese. First, a reminder that this is a pastoral plan, not a strategic plan. A strategic plan answers the question "What do we need to plan on doing for the next few years?" while a pastoral plan answers the question "What does God want us to do for the next few years?" I myself went through a period of accepting God's plan for my future when I first learned of the move that I was asked to make. I had to make that shift from thinking "Where do I think I need to go?" to "Where does God need me to go?" That led me to a place of peace with not only the particular assignment but with my priesthood in general. Frankly, I found it was a real blessing to be so spiritually at peace as this ended up happening right before everyone was asked to stay at home in mid-March.

The week before the new assignments were announced in early March, there was meeting of all of us priests in the diocese about *Uniting in Heart*. It was at this meeting that all of the new assignments for the priests were revealed. I had two reactions once I saw the new distribution of clergy. The first was that it was nothing like what I would have guessed or planned myself. The second reaction was that the mix of pastorates (the collectives of parishes) and priests made a lot of sense in how well they matched the needs of the people with the gifts of their incoming shepherds. That included seeing that Fr. Andrew DeKeyser and Fr. Jeff Martin were coming to the pastorate here for Fulton and Pulaski counties, whom I feel will make a really good team of spiritual leaders for the people in this area of the diocese. In other words, I saw how the Holy Spirit knows the diocese and how we can best evangelize our communities better than I could even imagine. Just as in today's first reading Peter preached about Jesus as one who "received the promise of the Holy Spirit from the Father," so we who are one with Christ in our baptism can see the promises of the Holy Spirit being fulfilled in our midst.

## Del Padre Miguel

La semana pasada hablé sobre el proceso de discernimiento que condujo al cambio en las asignaciones para los sacerdotes. Esta semana me gustaría continuar contándoles por qué creo que el Plan Pastoral *Unidos en Corazón 2030* es realmente un regalo para nuestra diócesis. Primero, un recordatorio de que este es un plan pastoral, no un plan estratégico. Un plan estratégico responde a la pregunta "¿Qué debemos planear hacer en los próximos años?" mientras que un plan pastoral responde a la pregunta "¿Qué quiere Dios que hagamos en los próximos años?" Yo mismo pasé por un período de aceptación del plan de Dios para mi futuro cuando supe por primera vez el movimiento que me pidieron que hiciera. Tuve que hacer ese cambio de pensar "¿A dónde creo que tengo que ir?" a "¿A dónde necesita Dios que vaya?" Eso me llevó a un lugar de paz no solo con la tarea particular sino con mi sacerdocio en general. Francamente, descubrí que era una verdadera bendición estar tan espiritualmente en paz, ya que esto terminó sucediendo justo antes de que se les pidiera a todos quedarse en casa a mediados de marzo.

La semana antes de que se anunciaran las nuevas asignaciones a principios de marzo, todos los sacerdotes de la diócesis se reunieron para *Unidos en Corazón 2030*. Fue en esta reunión que se revelaron todas las nuevas asignaciones para los sacerdotes. Tuve dos reacciones una vez que vi la nueva distribución del clero. La primera fue que no se parecía en nada a lo que yo habría adivinado o planeado. La segunda reacción fue que la mezcla de pastores (los colectivos de las parroquias) y los sacerdotes tenía mucho sentido en lo bien que combinaban las necesidades de las personas con los dones de sus pastores entrantes. Eso incluyó ver que el Padre. Andrew DeKeyser y el p. Jeff Martin venía al pastorado aquí para los condados de Fulton y Pulaski, quienes creo que serán un muy buen equipo de líderes espirituales para las personas en esta área de la diócesis. En otras palabras, vi cómo el Espíritu Santo conoce a la diócesis y cómo podemos evangelizar mejor nuestras comunidades mejor de lo que podría imaginar. Al igual que en la primera lectura de hoy, Pedro predicó acerca de Jesús como alguien que "recibió la promesa del Espíritu Santo del Padre", así nosotros, que somos uno con Cristo en nuestro bautismo, podemos ver las promesas del Espíritu Santo cumpliéndose en medio de nosotros.

**MESSAGE FROM OUR BISHOP TIMOTHY DOHERTY**

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We are facing difficult times. I understand some of what you're each going through. For example, I haven't been able to visit with my own mother since Christmas and her building has been on lockdown for the last month. Each time I speak to a new person, clergy member, or business employer, I hear about the daunting circumstances that so many experience.

People hunger to get back into church. Decisions about Masses and sacraments are complex. I ask for your continued patience. I'm regularly consulting with the bishops across our state, attending to federal and local state (Indiana) pronouncements and weighing the advice of healthcare officials. My main concern is for the pastoral care for souls in our diocese.

Each bishop has his own geographical jurisdiction and I must make decisions that I think are best for our diocese. I hear from many groups, organizations and individuals advising as to how I should handle things. Through consultation with my own advisory committees I will do what is best for us. Things that work well within one family don't work for every other. The same is true from diocese to diocese.

Much work is done behind the scenes by our own employees and clergy. I have personnel responsibilities to the 1,600 people that the diocese and parishes employ on over 60 sites—including teachers and clergy, office and maintenance staffs. We have been adapting to new technologies and putting in countless hours to help support our parishes and schools to meet the needs of our students. Both the parishes and our central office have had to be inventive.

It's important to me that we remain connected. It's important to me that we remain connected. Our diocesan office of communications continues to update information regarding news, livestreamed Masses, prayer opportunities and catechetical ideas for families on our website: <https://dol-in.org/covid-19-updates>. I will be celebrating Mass at Church of the Blessed Sacrament on Mother's Day, May 10 at 8 a.m. Eastern time. This Mass will be livestreamed through the parish website: <http://churchoftheblessedsacrament.yourstreamlive.com/>.

We may be keeping to our shelters, but we can be united in Christ. We might be alone in our praying, but it brings us into a communion with the whole church. If you think that current events are shocking and confusing, think about the Apostles—their friend was killed and now he eats and talks with them. Into whatever disorientation we might be feeling, invite the Risen Lord into our company—he enters our space saying to us "Peace be with you." And on our Lord's behalf, I also wish you peace.
