Dear Parishioners and friends of St. Lawrence:

As Fr. Jim Farrell was coming to give St. Lawrence a Lenten Mission, I volunteered to cover for his parish, St. Pius, in Indianapolis.

It wasn't my expectation that at our meeting of the clergy this past Tuesday that this was to be the day that all the priests learned their new assignments beginning the end of June. We were given permission to inform our parishioners where we are going and who is coming.

Even though I had asked to stay for the final two years until I'm 75, it wasn't granted. The diocesan advisors believed that if some priests remained while other parishes lost their pastors, it would create some bitterness and interfere with a smooth transition for all the parishes to work together. So, the decision was reached that I needed to be reassigned as both Fr. Andrew and Fr. Brian were also being reassigned. At first it was difficult to swallow, but I've always remembered that when I was ordained I promised "obedience to Bishop Gallagher and his successors." It is part of the original deal at the beginning of my priesthood – guess it will end that way as well.

There is some very good news in all this. My new assignment is as a Senior Associate and Fr. Tom Metzger will be the pastor of the parishes in Anderson and Alexandria. I have cousins in both towns and Fr. Tom will have all the headaches for the three parishes.

Even though I would like to have stayed in Muncie, I am excited for Muncie that you are receiving three young priests – full of energy and spiritual zeal. The pastor will be Fr. Eric Underwood who has always been very personal in his parishes and loved by them. The two Parochial Vicars are Fr. Christian DeCarlo from Zionsville and Fr. Coady Owens from Fishers. Fr. Coady Owens was ordained in June 2017 and Fr. Christian DeCarlo was ordained in June of 2018. Both are leaving their first assignments which is always difficult because for most priests the people of that parish become very close to your heart. So, it will be difficult and don't be surprised when they refer to you by the name of their first parish: "Our Lady" (our Lady of Mt. Carmel) and "Holy Spirit" or "Geist" (Holy Spirit at Geist). But Muncie is receiving a great gift of three young priests. It won't take long for you to love all three. Oh, I forgot, the old-timer of the group is Fr. Eric Underwood who was ordained in June of 2006. He has 14 years under his belt.

I will be back next weekend and we have a few months to say our goodbyes. For me it has been a good and very wonderful time to have come back to Muncie and renew many old connections. My only goal was to try and leave the parish better for the pastor or priests who would follow me.

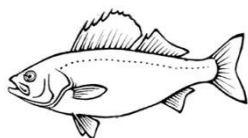
