Report from Fr. Mark on Catholic Charities Building

People have asked me what is happening with the Catholic Charities building on Andrews Highway. It has been closed for many months. Here is my report:

The June hail storm and the rains that followed heavily damaged the roof and interior of the building. Mold developed and asbestos was exposed. The building became unusable.

The leadership of Catholic Charities (executive director and board) started to work with the insurer (Catholic Mutual), the Diocese of San Angelo and roofing companies to repair the damage. I am not sure they were experienced enough in matters like these to handle this project by themselves.

A wiser plan would have been to reach out to the Catholic community of Odessa for help: the priests and people who support CC. In the Catholic community are lawyers, experts in insurance claims, civic officials, contractors, etc. With their expertise, these people – who love Catholic Charities -- could have formed a task-force and completed this project in rapid order, leaving the regular work of Catholic Charities to the director, staff and board.

Here's an instance that especially troubles me: Instead of asking us pastors if our parishes had space to house CC activities forced out of the building – activities like the pantry and the Cory Leaning Center -- the CC administration instead rented space at Parker Heights Christian Church for \$800 a month. The rent may be recouped from insurance, but all the parishes could have given space free of charge.

As things dragged on, the CC leaders hired a consulting firm to complete the job. CC does not pay the consulting firm; they earn their pay through the subcontractors and the insurance company. *(This was another missed opportunity to appeal to the Catholic community for help.)* While this firm appears to be doing a good job, they have a penchant for hiring out-of-town subs, not local ones. I think we should “buy the basin” whenever we can ...

To make a long story short, the roof is repaired, the mold and asbestos are being treated and the final phase of the project – re-sheet rocking and re-tiling – will begin shortly. With luck, the building may be open by the end of January.

The insurance company (Catholic Mutual) has been most generous and Catholic Charities will come through this crisis without much financial loss. The ones who have suffered are the poor of Odessa because so many aspects of CC have

been out of commission for far too long.

Hopefully lessons were learned here, and when the next hail storm comes – as indeed it will in West Texas – we will all be ready!!!

BAPTISM

PREP CLASS-Our next baptism preparation class is Saturday, January 6 @ 9 a.m. **You must call to register for this class.** Please call after December 19. If there is no answer, dial 21 for Vickie's ext. and leave a message.

To Schedule a Baptism-In order to baptize at St. Elizabeth's, the parents of the child should be registered members of St. Elizabeth's, or live within our boundaries. Parents please come to the office to schedule your child's baptism. You will need to bring in the baby's birth certificate, **from the county**, the godparents' confirmation certificates, if the godparents are married, a copy of their church marriage certificate and proof of baptism prep classes for parents and godparents. We do baptisms the 1ST, 2ND and 3RD weekends of each month. Baptisms held on the 3RD weekend will be in **Spanish, if requested**. The first person to come into the office with all necessary paperwork to register for a weekend will get to pick which day, Saturday or Sunday, for **all** baptisms that weekend. You must register in the office, before the date of your child's baptism and you must have all paperwork!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Children of the parish are somewhat focused on Santa Claus these days, who is keeping an eye on who's naughty and who's nice. Santa Claus, with his heavenly patron Saint Nicholas, has been more or less in charge of gift-giving to American children for a hundred years or so. In other places, perhaps more attentive to our Christian tradition, there are different gift-bearers. In Greece, Saint Basil delivers the presents on his feast day, December 31, and makes sure everyone is sprinkled with holy water. The Baby Jesus is in charge elsewhere, called the *Christkind* in Austria and Belgium, *El Niño Jesús* in Columbia, and *Le Petit Jesus* in France, where he shares his duties with *Père Noël*. In the Czech Republic almost everyone is atheist, but *Ježíšek*, the infant Jesus, brings gifts to one and all. In Poland the "Star Man" is said to bring the gifts, although often he turns out to be the village priest in disguise. Saint Nicholas, not his Americanized cousin, is the giver in Holland, where he wears a bishop's miter, and in Russia, where he wears a bishop's crown. Soviet Russia tried to dethrone Saint Nicholas and promote Grandfather Frost, but no one was much fooled by this attempt to squeeze religion out of Christ's birth. One country has a saintly woman in charge of the gifts, Saint Lucy, honored in Sweden on December 13, when children serve their parents breakfast in bed, and others awake to news that they have been nominated for a Nobel Prize. Some children have a second round of gifts on Epiphany, when the magi assume the gift-giving duties. In general, the gifts of Christmas are simple pleasures, not great heaps of treasures. Once upon a time, a new pair of socks or an orange was enough for us. No matter what gifts we receive, all of them are to point us to the true gift, and the true giver.

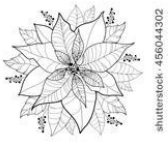
