WEDDING MUSIC

In the Sacrament of Matrimony, you and your spouse establish a lifelong partnership with one another, joined by the love and strength of God. This outward expression of Christlike love encourages the participation of the parish community, witnessing your undivided love as a daily light of faith.

Sacred music for your wedding expresses the themes of this Sacrament in a way that is meaningful to you as a couple, draws in the presence of God in all those gathered, and appropriately expresses the faith of the Church. By its nature, music is live (not recorded) and encourages the prayerful participation of all. We have carefully selected three music program options for you to choose from.

After meeting with the priest, please schedule a meeting with the Music Director, who will be able to assist in planning music for your wedding ceremony.

A payment of **\$300** (cash or check) includes an organist and a cantor (soloist) from St. Elizabeth's music ministry. Cantors can sing in both English and Spanish, and are selected by the Music Director.

If desired, we can arrange for additional instrumentalists (such as violin or trumpet) which add to the depth and beauty of your ceremony. They are hired at their individual rates. While a cantor from St. Elizabeth's is required to lead in the sung prayer of this liturgy, we are able to collaborate with outside musicians within reason, and we ask an additional rehearsal fee of **\$100** (in addition to any fees they may charge).

We can also provide a printed worship aid (program) with the order of service and music for your ceremony. This assists all gathered to participate and praise the Lord for the joy of love.

The deadline for all fees is 30 days before the date of your ceremony in order to secure musicians.
