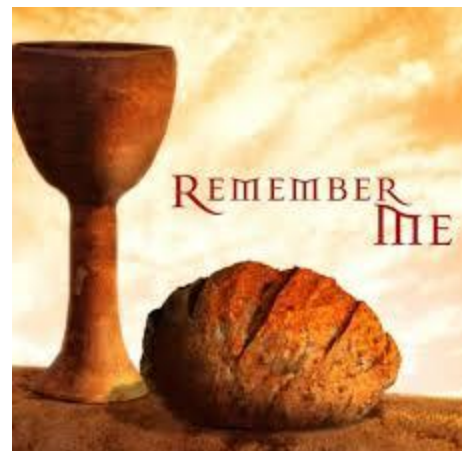

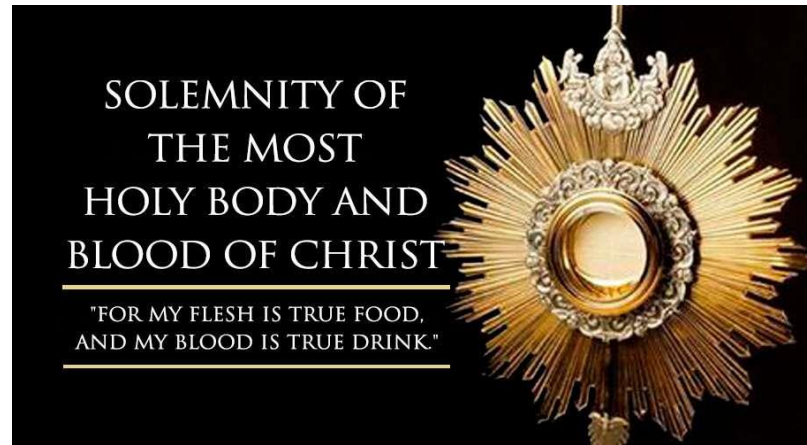


*Solemnity of the Body  
and Blood of Christ*



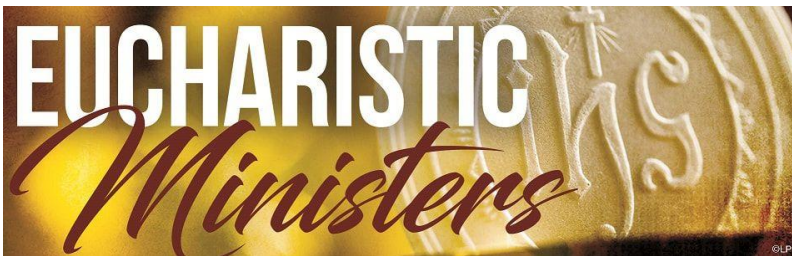
*Oh, by the way,*

This week-end, the Universal Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." The Solemnity originated in France in the mid-13th century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. This feast is celebrated on the Thursday following the Trinity Sunday or, as in the USA, on the Sunday following that feast.



*Interesting pastoral regulation:* The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is one of five (5) occasions in the year on which a diocesan bishop is not to be away from his diocese unless for a grave and urgent reason.

As directed by our Local Church, Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion are



commissioned on this Solemnity. The Commission to serve as an Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion is a delegation from the Bishop. So, wherever you are, you are commissioned this week-end! These Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion are commissioned to serve for

one (1) year...till the Solemnity of Corpus Christi 5/6 June 2021.

There have been many questions, concerns, criticisms (positive & negative) and suggestions about moving back into our church buildings. I believe most, if not all, issues were addressed in either the Bishop's statement: **COVID-19 Decree May 8 2020: from Bishop Doherty (the most recent update is now on our web page)** or my letter **21 May 2020: fr.K's letter about rejoining together as a faith family for Mass**. I would like to remind everyone in our Cluster that both of these documents are posted on our Cluster web page. (And there's a lot more information on our web page: daily Masses posted, everything Cluster related posted there. Take a gander!) Thank you.



The Church has been coordinated with the State government guidelines. Governor Holcomb announced STAGE 4 recently for Hoosiers: Stage 4. 12:01 A.M. Friday, June 12.

- **Face coverings:** Now optional
- **Social gatherings:** Up to 250 people
- **State government buildings:** Access restrictions will be lifted
- **Professional office buildings:** Employees may resume work at full capacity
- **Retail stores and malls:** Open at full capacity with social distancing guidelines in place
- **Dining room service:** May open at 75% capacity
- **Bar seating in restaurants:** May open at 50% capacity
- **Bars and nightclubs:** May open at 50% capacity adhering to social distancing guidelines

- **Cultural, entertainment and tourism businesses:** May open at 50% capacity. This includes museums, zoos, bowling alleys, aquariums and movie theaters.
- **Recreational sports leagues and tournaments:** May resume
- **Large venues:** May open with social gatherings guidelines
- **Amusement parks and water parks:** Facilities may open at 50% capacity; reservations will be required to limit the number of customers at any one time.
- **Most vulnerable population:** Hoosiers 65 and over and those with high-risk health conditions should follow social distancing guidelines and remain cautious.

Meanwhile, remember last month I mentioned that everything liturgical is fluid during COVID-19? Well, here's the latest changeability beginning Monday, 15 June, for us. If you have any questions, please call for clarification.

**Business Office:** Previously closed to the public, now operates with limited public hours. Please call to schedule a time (social distancing required).

**Daily Mass** may occur! Current entrance/exit doors will be used. All CDC including social-distancing guidelines are still in effect. Administration of Holy Communion is to occur immediately after Mass. **Masks are optional but highly encouraged.** The back section of St. Joseph and St. Peter will be 'blocked off', less sanitizing!

**Sunday Mass:** Current entrance/exit doors will be used. All CDC including social-distancing guidelines are still in effect. Administration of Holy Communion is to occur immediately after Mass. **Masks are optional but highly encouraged.** The Liturgy is limited to one musician and one cantor ONLY. The Responsorial Psalm is recited. The entrance Antiphon and Communion Antiphon may be sung by the cantor. Entrance procession may now include servers.

**Live-streaming:** daily and week-end liturgies continue. Barring any unforeseen circumstances, our Diocesan Phase D is scheduled for the week-end of 4-5 July (which again coincides with State of Indiana Stage 5). For now, we slowly open up and wash our hands.

The **dispensation** regarding Mass attendance remains in effect.
