Due the on-going disruption of COVID-19, the final part of Uniting in Heart:

Permanent Deacon – Permanent Deacons are called forth from the community to serve a diaconal ministry in the Church, whether pastoral, charitable, social or liturgical. They are appointed by the bishop to be a part of the clergy team of a parish. In addition to assisting in the liturgical function of the parish, deacons should also be assigned to serve according to his gifts and charisms.

Finance Council – In addition to the responsibilities outlined in the Code of Canon Law, the finance council is to help the pastor direct the temporal resources of the parish in order to accomplish the missionary vision set out by the pastor and the pastoral council. This group must meet regularly and is responsible for creating the parish budget, approving the financial statements, overseeing the revenue and expenses related to operating the parish, communication to parishioner with transparency and encouraging them to support the mission by their giving. According to Canon Law, every parish will have a finance council.



Passion-Driven-Stewardship – Is the grateful response of every Christian disciple to share our God given gifts of time, talent and treasure, in a way that passionately sets our hearts on fire and touches the lives of others, as we live the corporal and spiritual works of mercy through Hospitality, Prayer, Formation and Service.

Corporal Works of Mercy – Charitable actions by which we come to the physical needs of our neighbors and give a Christian witness to the world. They include: feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, sheltering the homeless, and burying the dead. Of such works, giving alms to the poor is a special sign of charity and an act pleasing to God. (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2447)

Spiritual Works of Mercy – Charitable actions by which we come to the spiritual needs of our neighbors. They include: instructing, advising, consoling, comforting, forgiving, patiently forbearing, and praying for the dead.

Universal Call to Holiness – A phrase stressed in the Second Vatican Council’s Dogmatic Constitution on the Church (Lumen Gentium), it recognizes that all the People of God are “called to the fullness of the Christian life and to the perfection of charity” (no. 40). This call is directed not only to priests, deacons, and consecrated religious, but to the laity as well, and should be pursued within an individual’s specific vocation and state in life. The example of a holy life is one way the faithful evangelize the world.

The People of God – An image of the Christian faithful, the Church, who are called and chosen by God through baptism. This phrase originates in the Old Testament where the Israelites are referred to as God’s chosen people.

The Sacrament of Communion or Unity – The Church is the Sacrament of Communion because She is God's instrument to bring human beings into Communion with God and with each other through the grace of the sacraments.

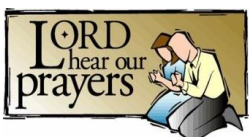
