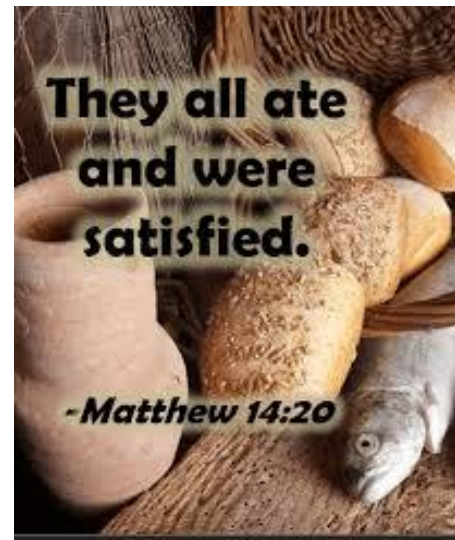

Latest (28 July) from the Bishop's Office:

Good evening, Everyone.

The Indiana Governor's Executive Order 20-37 reaffirms the importance of wearing face coverings and mandates specific times, activities, and spaces in which face coverings must be worn from now until August 26, 2020. The Executive Order could be modified, rescinded or extended and if necessary any updates from the diocese will follow. No. 4 of the Executive Order lists the exemptions which include, but are not limited to: children under two years of age, disability of underlying condition which prevents wearing a face covering, consuming food or drink, and engaging in exercising or sport activity while maintaining six feet of social distancing.

Worship:

According to no. 4.o of the Executive Order, "any person attending or engaged in a religious service as he or she must already maintain six feet of social distancing from another person not in the same household." The Executive Order does not currently affect diocesan worship services. Parishes within the diocese are to continue to follow all "Return to Worship-Phase D" directives. Phase D outlines when masks are optional or required throughout liturgies and sacraments.

Other Parish Ministries and Schools:

Parish ministries are to continue to encourage face coverings, and parish plans must account for all logistics and supplies for ministry activities such as youth ministry, religious education, RCIA, sacramental preparation, bible studies, receptions, etc.. Masks are required in any indoor or outdoor gathering in which the six feet minimum social distancing cannot be maintained. No. 6 of the Executive Order lists the special requirements for educational institutions. Catholic Schools are to follow Diocesan Catholic Schools guidelines.

Workplaces:

According to no. 1.a of the Executive Order the face covering requirement, "does not extend to private offices, private workspaces or meeting in which six feet of social distancing can be achieved." Diocesan workplaces are to continue to follow the "Return to Work" directives with face coverings required in shared or public spaces, lobbies, reception areas, waiting areas, and any gatherings or meetings in which the minimum of six feet for social distancing cannot be maintained.

Employees working in individual offices are not required to wear masks while inside their office.

→→As a reminder, each parish is to continue to adhere to federal, state and local guidelines, therefore, depending on the county or town mandates individual parishes might need to make suitable modifications to their individual parish and/or school plans.

- You may feel unqualified, uneducated, untrained, under-gifted or even not worthy, yet...those are excellent qualifications for God to do mighty work!

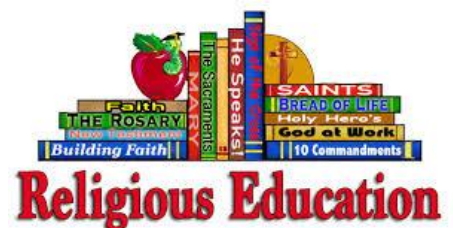

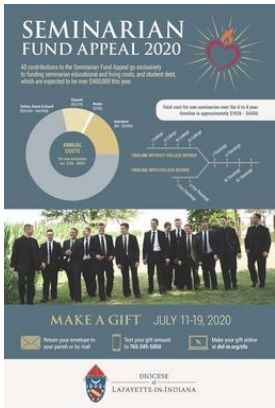

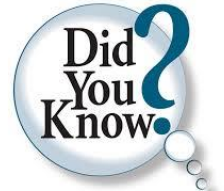
● **Seminarian Fund Appeal 2020**
