Oh, by the way,

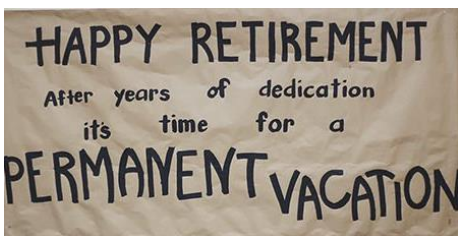

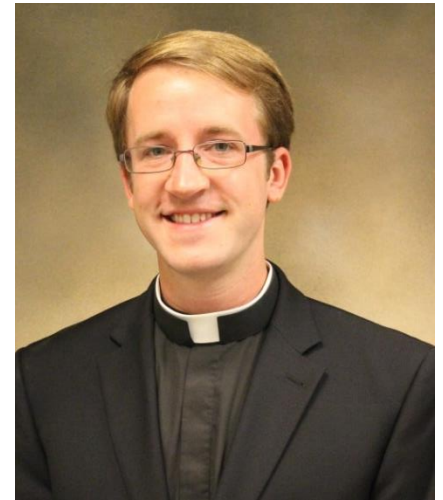

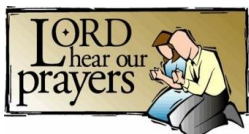
