It's that time of the year again for Elementary CCD Registration. Fr. Marse and Fr. Hymel have decided to combine classes for CCD. We welcome the St. Hubert students. We do have some changes this year for our classes. There will be more classes, but with less time for each class. The Archdiocese has indicated that the students need to have more classes during the year. We are making this year a transition year adding a few more classes and later adding on more classes during the coming years.

Classes will be held on Saturdays **from 8:30 a.m. till 10:00 a.m.** This time will work well for the students, especially with school activities and other activities that the students were involved in.

Please keep the schedule handy for the dates. The first class is scheduled for **Saturday, August 10th**, and the last class is **April 4th**. We will use the same textbooks as last year. Students will need a folder to bring their lesson sheets and newsletters home. No other supplies are needed. Students may bring snacks.

A reminder is that attendance at the classes is necessary for promotion to the next grade. We do not intend of making up any classes for students who miss the required number of classes. We also have the obligation of Mass attendance. Students will have to sign the book at the front entrance of the church or bring in a bulletin from the church that they attended for Mass. Please make every effort to see that your child fulfills his/her Mass obligations.

Registration will be held on Saturday, **August 3rd, at 9:00 a.m. till 10:00 a.m.**, in the Lacour Center. Registration fees will be collected at that time. Fees are as follows:

Grades 1 - 8 \$35 for one child
\$45 for two children
\$55 for three or more children

We ask that all students be registered by the first class, August 10th.

A MINDSET OF SERVICE

There's a lot of traveling, delivering, and visiting going on in our readings today. In Genesis Abraham cares for the needs of three mysterious travelers. The psalm responds, celebrating the kind of righteousness that Abraham practices. Then, in his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes his own ministry as almost like a delivery service: he, God's steward, brings the word of God to their community. Finally, Luke's Gospel shares the well-known story of Mary and Martha, and the different ways they welcome Jesus into their home. Amid all this coming and going, we are invited to pay attention to the ways we tend to the needs of others. Each of us can ask, *How am I present to God and others in my life?*
