"In Flanders Fields" is a poem written during World War I by Canadian physician Lieutenant-Colonel John McRae. He was inspired to write it on May 3, 1915, after presiding over the funeral of friend and fellow soldier Lieutenant Alexis Helmer, who died in the Second Battle of Ypres (Belgium).

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini , M.S.C., was a 19th-20th century Italian woman who founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. She worked as a missionary in several areas of the United States, including New Orleans where she established an orphanage which evolved into Cabrini High School. **Her feast day is November 13.**

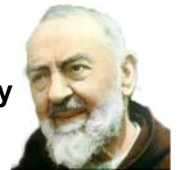
