Welcome to October: the Respect Life Month for Catholics

"To be truly a people at the service of life we must propose these truths constantly and courageously from the very first proclamation of the Gospel, and thereafter in catechesis, in the various forms of preaching, in personal dialogue and in all educational activity." Pope Saint John Paul II (EV 82)

The annual Respect Life Program is a year-round, nationwide effort to help Catholics understand, value, and become engaged with building a culture that cherishes every human life. The Respect Life Program requires the efforts of all Catholics in the Church, like you—parish priests, staff, and volunteers, teachers and school administrators, diocesan leaders, parents and other respected adults. There are many Respect Life Program materials available to help leaders, volunteers, and all lovers of life, integrate respect for human life into their respective work and/or ministries. You can request these materials from any Catholic Church parish or from the Archdiocesan Pro-life office. The annual cycle of the Respect Life Program reminds us of the need to be a part of it in word, action and practice.

As Pope Saint John Paul II wrote, "We need to bring the Gospel of life to the heart of every man and woman and to make it penetrate every part of society" (Evangelium vitae 80). Our goal is therefore to help you integrate the Respect Life message into the very life of your family, parish, school, or ministry. It's against current federal law to discriminate against medical professionals who conscientiously refuse to participate in destroying unborn life. Catholics therefore, are hardly alone in fighting for civil rights of conscience!

The battle is ongoing. This is why I wish to invite you as we enter the month of October, to use the Holy Rosary as one of the weapons to fight for life and against its violations around the world.

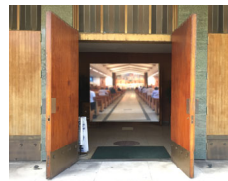

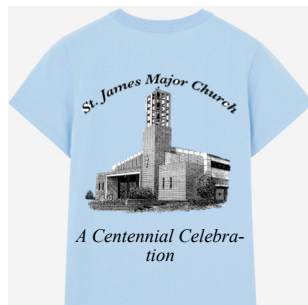

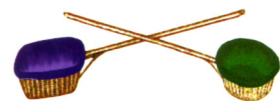
