HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY

The Catholic Church dedicates the month of November to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Holy Souls are all the faithful who have died in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified. They are assured of heaven, but after death they undergo purification to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven (CC 1030). The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect. The Holy Souls are part of the Communion of Saints that we believe in and profess when we pray the Apostles' Creed. This refers to the communion of all the faithful of Christ, those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified, and the blessed in heaven, all together forming one Church (CC 962). From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead. The Holy Souls in Purgatory feel completely abandoned. They cannot pray for themselves. We must pray for their deliverance from Purgatory into heaven. They are our relatives and friends, gone from our sight, but remaining in our hearts, and we are urged by the Church, charity and gratitude to pray not only for them but also for all the Holy Souls. Our prayer for them is capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercession for us effective (CC 958)
