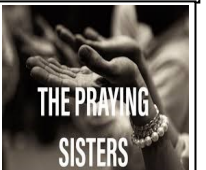

**LIVESTREAMING:** We will be livestreaming our weekend Masses and daily Mass at the scheduled time. We are offering two different options to watch.

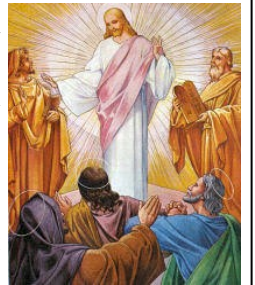
