THE CHRISTMAS SEASON STARTS ON CHRISTMAS DAY: Judging by the number of Christmas trees that are put out to the curb on December 26, many people believe that Christmas Day ends the Christmas season. They couldn't be more wrong: Christmas Day is the *first* day of Christmas. The period of feasting continues until Epiphany, the 12th day after Christmas, and the Christmas season traditionally continued until the feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Candlemas)—February 2—a full 40 days after Christmas Day! (Since the revision of the liturgical calendar in 1969, however, the liturgical season of Christmas ends with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord; the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time begins the next day.)<https://www.thoughtco.com/when-does-the-christmas-season>

CARES ACT DEDUCTION FOR CHURCH DONATIONS

The CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) created two temporary changes to the tax treatment of charitable donations. For the 9 out of 10 people who no longer itemize their charitable giving, the CARES Act allows taxpayers to deduct donations to our Church of up to \$300 on their 2020 federal tax return, even though they take the standard deduction. Married-filing jointly taxpayers will get an above-the-line deduction of up to \$600. For more information, please contact the parish office or your tax preparer.
