Dear Parishioners,

As I mentioned in the last Pastor's Notes, I will provide a more in-depth reflection on the discipline of almsgiving that is asked of us as part of our Lenten spiritual plan.

Now, just as prayer is meant to help us to begin to think as God does and fasting is meant to help us to hunger for the things for which God hungers, the ultimate purpose of almsgiving is to help us to enter into a deeper communion with God by sharing with others the providential care He has first given us.

The word "almsgiving" is derived from the old English *aelmesse*, which comes from the Greek word *eleemosyna* for mercy, as in *Kyrie, eleison*, "Lord, have mercy." Almsgiving refers principally not to the giving of goods to the less fortunate, but having Christ-like compassion that leads us to do all we can for those in need.

There is an obvious material dimension to giving alms, since many suffer in various forms of material need. Genuinely sacrificing our money and possessions, that is, giving not just something but giving to the point that we ourselves go without something we need for someone who needs it more.

Notice, the Gospel does not list many material benefactions of Jesus. Jesus' principal alms is the gift of Himself. For example, the Gospel records that His "heart was moved with pity" and, as a result, He taught, healed, fed, forgave and resuscitated.

For this reason, almsgiving involves, not just giving food to the hungry, clothing to the naked and welcome to strangers, but also visiting the sick and imprisoned, teaching and counseling those in need, forgiving and calling people from sin, praying perseveringly for the living and the dead and other personal acts. In other words, it demands both the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy!

As I've learned from my friend, Abbot Marion, who is well known for his ministry of note writing, he recognizes that living in a religious community who all make vow or promise of poverty and so their almsgiving can seldom take on the form of giving money or possessions.

So, he recommends to his monks to give of themselves and their time. He asks them to consider making a commitment each day to give at least 15 minutes reaching out to care for someone whom they know to be in need, to pray for that person and to visit, make a phone call, or write a letter or email.

In his own practice of this, he has discovered that once this intentional act begins with dedicating oneself to an extra 15 minutes a day to this type of almsgiving, one's charity does not stop at the quarter-hour. But rather it begins to have a ripple effect through life.

The point is simply this: just as prayer ought to be scheduled rather than spontaneous, the same goes for charity. It is not sufficient to wait for someone in need to come to us, we need to go out in search of them for they are Christ in our midst, "whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (c.f. Matthew 25: 40).

"Fasting and Abstinence Regulations" for the Archdiocese of Portland

- All Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on Fridays of Lent, Ash Wednesday, and Good Friday.
- All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. To fast means to eat one full meal; the other two meals that day should be less than the normal amount unless they are already at a minimum for good health. Eating between meals is not permitted; however, liquids including coffee, milk, and fruit juices are allowed.
