Dear Parishioners,

The Pew Research Center reported a year ago in 2019 a statistic that showed that 65% of Americans identify themselves as Christians which is down 12% in just the last 10 years. However, those describing themselves as atheists, agnostics and “nothing in particular” (aka Nones) are now at 26% of the populations, up 9%.

These are staggering declines which frankly, the past 7 months and counting of the pandemic is only adding to the strains for Catholic dioceses, parishes, schools and seminaries dealing with the decline of faith. For this reason, at an institutional level, the hot topic for Bishops, pastors, Catholic School superintendents and parish pastoral and finance/administrative councils have been focused upon addressing this.

And at a personal level, they occupy a great deal of the minds and hearts of parents, grandparents, godparents, spouses, siblings, sons, daughters and friends as they pray for their loved ones whose choices have helped establish those trends. Many are at a loss of knowing what to say. Many lament that their prayers and interventions do not seem to be bearing any fruit.

For this reason, as I have shared with many: the power of prayer can NEVER be discounted. Never lose heart in prayer. In fact, prayers for loved ones do work miracles. In my 15 years as a priest, I have witnessed the beautiful scene of the Good Thief recapitulate itself when people have asked me to come to the bedside of family members who have been away from God for decades and who have said they don't want to see a priest.

I am reminded by a brother priest of mine who is a convert to the faith that even though his own parents were skeptical of his conversion and even his call to priesthood, he still responded to God's call. As a priest, he prayed for his parents and continued to live his vocation, allowing his priestly actions to speak. His mother converted, and a few years ago, his father finally converted and my own dad was his sponsor. Prayers do work!

Allow me to provide a few practical tips about praying for those who have chosen to stop, drifted away from the practice of the faith, or others who need prayers to take it up for the first time.

So that our prayer does not get reduced simply to prayer of petition, which can narrow our relationship with God, we should exercise all five different forms of prayer:

1. We should *praise and bless* God for how lovable and merciful He is.
2. We should *thank* Him for His savings will, patience, Fatherly solicitude, and for sending His Son and the Holy Spirit to make conversion possible.
3. We should *ask His forgiveness* for all those sins, ours and others.
4. We should make *petition* for ourselves, to grow in patience and hope as we pray perseveringly and seek to become an instrument of the Holy Spirit.
5. We should *make intercession* through the communion of saints for our lost sheep, that God will have mercy on them and perhaps send someone who can reach them at the depth God wants to and bring them home. Our intercession should be simple and straightforward: “Lord, the one that you love needs your help.”

As we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints this weekend, may we see the Pew Research Center data ultimately as a summons for the whole

Church to pray more and with greater insistence. The Lord has given each of us plenty of people to pray for, so let us begin by invoking the intercession of the Communion of Saints.

All you holy men and women of God and Saints in Heaven, *Pray for us!*
