## Looking to the Past and Creating a Better Future

In the 1830's a lay catechist by the name of Luika Kaumaka journeyed to the quiet town of Waialua to seek solace from the oppression related to the practice of her faith. It was in this place of harbor that she was able to cultivate the faith and build a small community of Hawaiian Catechumens.

In 1840, the sanctions against the practice of the Catholic faith was removed. This allowed the Bishop and priests who were banished from the Kingdom to return to Hawaii and begin to minister to the faithful.

After receiving a request, Bishop Rouchaze sent Father Joseph Desvult, SS.CC., to Waialua to minister to the early Catholic community. Not long after, 96 Hawaiians who were prepared by Luika Kaumaka were baptized. This was the humble beginnings of our parish.

Later in 1848, King Kamehameha IV granted Bishop Maigret's request to attain land to build a Church in Waialua. On May 8, 1853,

over a hundred and sixty-six (166) years ago, this humble Waialua Catholic community was given a proper place of worship that was placed under the patronage of St. Michael the Archangel.

Since then, this community of faith has gone through countless dedicated priests, three churches and many faithful people who have given their all in service of our God. We remember all parishioners this weekend. All the countless sacrifices many made to help build this Church. The time spent in prayer, the multitude of talents that were used to further the mission of the Church and even the treasures donated out of the goodness of their hearts.

We acknowledge the tireless work of the priests, religious and deacons who have served in our parish. We thank them for their relentless commitment to Holy Mother Church and for their courage to bring faith, hope, and love to the faithful of God.

As we celebrate the 166th year under the patronage of St. Michael, let us remember all who have gone before us to make this Church what it is today. The

work is never done and more help is needed. Let us never stop working for the good of all and continue to live out the faith in any way possible.

As members of this parish, we have deep roots that extends beyond 166 years and it is something worth celebrating. Let us always do our best for the one who deserves the best and give our all for the God who has given his all for us.

May the love of God rest always upon you and your families, may his mercy lead you deep into his most Sacred Heart and may he empower you by the Holy Spirit to go forth and share the Good News of his resurrection with the whole world. Amen.

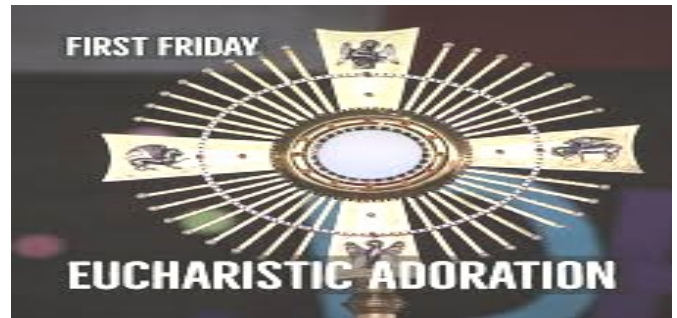
