**ADMINISTRATOR'S
 CORNER**



In our first reading (Exodus 17:8-13) while the Israelites were in the desert, Amalek, one of the enemies, waged war against the Israelites but God remained faithful to his promise to protect them through Moses, Joshua and Hur. If Moses kept his hands raised up, Israel had the better fight.

In our second reading (2 Tim 3:14-4:2) Paul exhorts Timothy to remain faithful to the scriptures and to the teachings of Jesus Christ. To be persistent in proclaiming the word whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince and reprimand and encourage by

means of patience and teaching.

In our Gospel (Luke 18:1-8) Jesus told his disciples a parable about the importance of ceaseless prayer. When a widow asking the Judge, who does not fear God nor respect anybody, to render justice to her adversary lest she strike him, it brings to us the meaning of persistence. Ceaseless prayer is not being hopeless but more of being hopeful and of living the faith.

The three readings for today tells us the meaning of persistence and that God is infinitely far better than the bad judge who gives in to the persistent widow. It is through prayer we communicate with our God and it does not bother Him if we constantly ask favors and it is not even a nuisance to him. The fruit of our persistence comes from our faith, and God always listen to our prayers.

When we pray, thank God first for everything; for our responsorial Psalm

tells us; "Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

Think about this: "Prayer doesn't just change things - it changes us. If we are diligent in seeking God, slowly and surely, we become better people." - Joyce Meyer

God is good. All the time!
