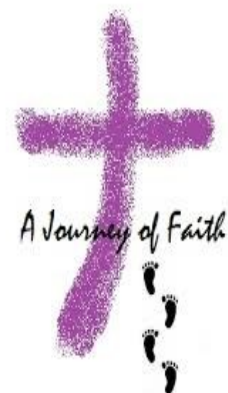

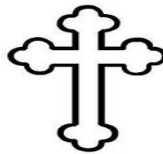
Final arrangements are made with the cooperation of the mortuary and priest. It is customary to contact the parish office **before completing arrangements.**

## Administrator's Corner

### Trustworthy Stewards Stewardship Series (3 of 3)

The scriptures tell us how the Community of Faith was built, but it was also hard for them in the beginning because of their fears and doubts, too; but they were strengthened by their faith in Christ. Now let us look into the invitation of the world. What are the popular ways that draws us together? Fundraising events, concerts, potlucks, etc. And Faith is usually the last thing. Our mission challenges us to live our baptismal promises by living our faith through prayer, service and generosity. To make our community of faith united through the WORD of God and through the EUCHARIST!

Accompanied with this challenge is the greatest threat to Community. Sin - rebellion against God that leads to rebellion against our neighbor (Gen 3), nothing else but arrogance - a camouflage of our insecurity, an arrogant illusion that we could be God! (Benedict XVI). And when we sin we create an illusionary world...a limitless world.

Arrogance makes us God wanting autonomous freedom with no limits - science with no morality, politics without conscience, arts at home with vulgarity...even a church giving priority to performance and image - no longer centered on GOD.

What then Jesus Christ teaches us, "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." (John 12:24).

He teaches us to be grain that falls to the earth and die! He teaches us to be humble. That even he is God did not deem equality with God but rather be emptied himself and took the form of a slave, obediently accepting even death - death on a cross. (cf Philippians 2:5-8). It is Cruciformity (shape of the Cross), Kenosis (radical Change of Heart), Theosis (being united with God). Humility of Christ means...a) "I will join you in becoming human." b) "Even if you are driving me away, I will come to you." c) This means community is solidarity out of love...that seeks solidarity with the one you love even unto death. d) Community is more powerful than death. Death trembles before a strong community! In short, our focus is the building of a parish that is truly a faith community immersed in the lives of its people.

*"I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them as you have loved me."* (John 17:20-23).

Questions for Reflection and Prayer:

- What have I done as a member to make the community entrusted to my care a genuine "community of faith?"
- In what way have I been tempted to arrogance and illusion as a member of this parish community?
- In what way have I been in solidarity to my fellow-members and to the people I serve?
