ADMINISTRATOR'S CORNER



In the 1st reading (Isaiah 2:1-5), Prophet Isaiah looks forward into the future. He sees the gathering of all nations into the eternal peace of the Kingdom of God. He proclaimed this message to strengthen the hope and trust of the people on what Yahweh can do for them.

In the 2nd reading (Romans 13:11-14), Paul reminds the Romans that the day of their salvation is already near and so they need to constantly be vigilant and conduct themselves properly as in a day. They are to put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provisions of the flesh.

We are now on our Liturgical Year, Cycle A. And we are on the first Sunday of Advent. Advent came from the Latin word Adventus which means to wait the arrival of someone or something that is of great importance. And for us Christians, it is the remembering of the arrival of Jesus as a baby and the second is that the second coming of Christ in Glory as judge.

The Gospel for this Sunday reminds us of testing and challenge. We listen and take to heart the announcements of the prophets for conversion and repentance for we do not know the day or the hour when the Son of Man will come. Jesus tries to remind us to be awake and be alert at all time preparing for the end of our lives. For we know what happened to those who did nothing to prepare themselves. Do not delay. Do not procrastinate. For those who plan for conversion at 11:00 die at 10:30.

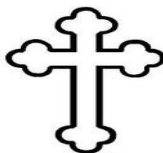
Final arrangements are made with the cooperation of the mortuary and priest. It is customary to contact the parish office **before completing arrangements.**

Administrator's Corner

STEWARDSHIP **(2 OF 2)**

One Bishop said, “Stewardship is an expression or manifestation of proactive servant hood. It is likewise an alternative to leadership. Stewards are therefore servant-leaders who are entrusted by God, (through the church or through people) to take care of and create a return from the resources that they have been entrusted with.

Failure in one’s stewardship is a SOCIAL SIN; one who fails thus may be removed from stewardship by God, (through the church or through people) depending on the nature of the failure” (*Abp. Angel Lagdameo*)

This is the thing, there is crisis in our Church now and “It comes down to this: Do our bishops and priests, our lay and religious leaders, have the will and courage to address this crisis candidly and confidently—inspired, not by the fear and suspicion...but by the openness and trust...?” (*Facing the Crisis in the Priesthood, Rev. Donald Cozzens, The National Catholic Weekly, Nov. 4, 2000.*) We have to face crisis.

Crisis has two meanings,

First: CONNOTES DANGER, PAIN, OR GREAT DISTRESS.

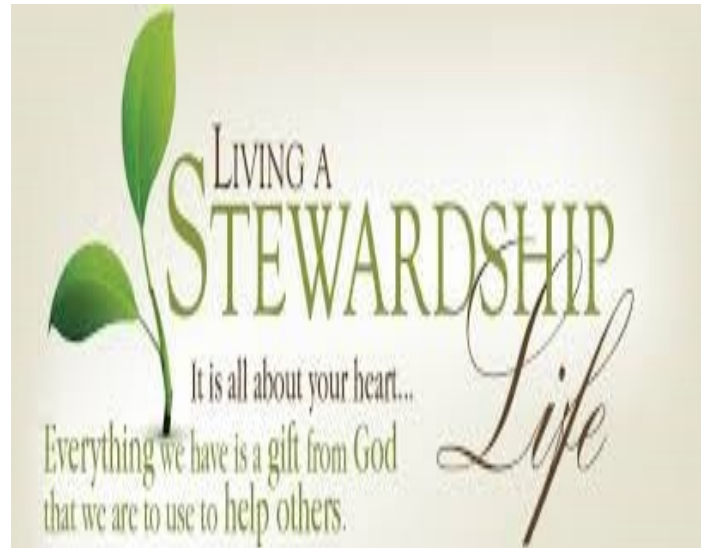
Second: BUT MAY ALSO BE A GREAT TIME OF OPPORTUNITY, AN INVITATION TO

DEEPER FAITH, A SUMMON TO A MORE THOROUGH CONVERSION. IT COULD MEAN A TREMENDOUS OPPORTUNITY FOR CONVERSION!

As accountable stewards, how do we address our crisis? Face hard realities that people will misunderstand, angry, frustrated and disappointed. Recognize the interconnected structures where problems arise. Acknowledge the need and urgency of being transparent.

1. A question and reflection to myself what concrete graces from God do I feel sustained me in me being a steward? Why?

2. What do I find helpful at present in my diocese that has sustained my stewardship and accountability as a child of God and the Church?
