The Domestic Church

The Catholic Church teaches that aside from the Universal Church there is a smaller Church known as the Domestic Church. The Domestic Church, according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, is “A community of grace and prayer, a school of human virtues and of Christian Charity.” So what makes up the Domestic Church?

The Domestic Church is the family. A mother and father and their children. This small Church or as St. Pope John Paul II refers to as “the Church in miniature”, is the place where faith is cultivated and formed. There are four cornerstones that make up the domestic Church.

Family Life is Sacred – Imagine that when you walk into your home, it feels as if you are walking into a Church. It’s almost hard to imagine but think about the Holy Family. Their home was very much a Church in miniature. As devout Jews the Holy Family practiced their faith not only in the synagogue on the Sabbath, but also in the home. Recognizing the sanctity of the family will help us to understand the second cornerstone.

Family Activity is Holy – Every activity and every action of the family should be holy. Do we pray together, do we eat together? Do our day to day activities exhibit holiness? When we model our actions as a family, and as individuals, after the Holy Family, we begin to build the foundations of a holy society. St. Pope John Paul II

once said, “As the family goes, so goes the nation and the whole world in which we live.” In a world in need of holiness we have to start with our families.

Families Have a Unique Ministry- A family in and of itself is a ministry. Parents as first teachers and sharers of the faith minister to each other and to their children to build a family of faith. When we recognize our role in the ministry of the family, we can begin to form our families. Parents as teachers and catechist, children as faithful followers. Each member doing its part to form the domestic Church.

Families Are an Evangelizing Community – A friend once told me that holiness is attractive. When a family knows, loves, and serves God it shows. The greatest way to evangelize is through examples. Every Domestic Church is a gateway to the Universal Church. As a family lives out their faith, they help to inspire others to live holy lives and eventually lead others to the fullness of the faith.

Strong faith-filled families are more important than ever before. If we begin to foster holy families and build our domestic churches, we can begin to change the world. We are not perfect, but holiness is not merely perfection. Holiness is making the effort to live in accordance with God’s will and admitting to failure. We may not be able to change every family, but as each Domestic Church does its part we can begin to change the world.
