SUNDAY REFLECTION



A Glimpse at Glory **By: Joshua Kapika**

One of my favorite Christian songs of all time is, "I Can Only Imagine" by Mercy Me. The lyrics are a refrain of wonder at what one might experience when finally coming face to face with God. In today's gospel Peter, James, and John get a taste of that glory by being witnesses to the transfiguration of Christ on the mountain top.

As Christians, our mind should always be focused on that image of the glorified Christ. Our hearts should desire to be in the presence of that glory. If we are not focused on the life after this one, we are living life completely wrong. Nothing

on this earth is worth even an eighth of what heaven is worth.

To be surrounded by God's glory is why we, as a Church, set aside forty days of praying, fasting, and almsgiving every year. We do these Lenten practices with the hope that one day we will see God's face, just as Peter, James, and John were able to see the face of the glorified Christ and live.

Lent is a time of change, a time when we put our mortal bodies under stress and restrain in order to gain control over our carnal nature and the tendency to sin. We are given a glimpse at the glory of God in today's gospel for the sake of encouraging us in our Lenten journey. Let us not give up. Let us not grow weary. Let us instead put our trust in Christ that one day we will be able to look beyond the veil and see him in his glory.

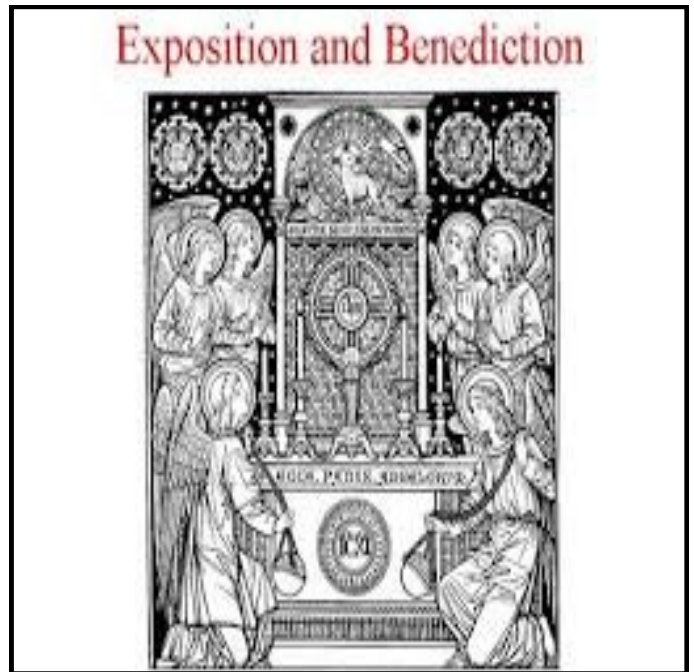

WHAT IS HOLY HOUR OF ADORATION

Holy Hour (Latin: hora sancta) is the Roman Catholic devotional tradition of spending an **hour** in Eucharistic **adoration** in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. A plenary indulgence is granted for this practice.

Adoration is a sign of devotion to and worship of Jesus Christ, who is believed by Catholics to be present Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, under the appearance of the consecrated host, that is, sacramental bread.

A **Benediction** (Latin: bene, well + dicere, to speak) is a short invocation for divine help, blessing and guidance, usually at the end of worship service. It can also refer to a specific Christian religious service including the exposition of the Eucharistic host in the monstrance and the blessing of the people with it.
