Dear Parishioners & Friends:

Aloha!

The COVID19 pandemic has changed our lives in so many ways. It has been a year since everyone and especially our elderly were isolating in their homes, our children were unable to attend school, and we were not able to gather for Sunday Mass. 

Alleluia! Christ is risen! What joy we feel when we hear those words on Easter! We have made it through the forty days of Lent. We have walked with Jesus on his journey to the cross in Holy Week. Now we can proclaim the good news of his resurrection and celebrate with all the angels and saints.

But Easter doesn't end today. As a Church, we celebrate Easter as an octave, for a full eight days. We celebrate it as a liturgical season, lasting fifty days, until Pentecost. And we celebrate it every Sunday throughout the year.

Kokua For Kupuna – New Oahu Vaccine Hotline Now Open!

Senior citizens age 65 years and over can now get easier access to COVID-19 vaccines, thanks to a new call center created in partnership with public, private and non-profit agencies. The **Oahu Kupuna Call Center** simplifies the registration process for aging residents who have not yet received their shots due to limited access to technology, transportation or translation services. Seniors and their caregivers can now just dial 2-1-1 and talk to a trained specialist to help answer questions, schedule appointments or request transportation to vaccination sites.

Many of our Kupuna have already been struggling food insecurity, housing and other medical challenges during the pandemic. Those who live alone without access to a computer or family to assist find it especially difficult to get vaccinated. National trends have shown that vaccine accessibility improves greatly when people are able to call a centralized phone number. That's why the state's <u>Department of Health - Executive Office on Aging</u> has partnered with the <u>City and County of Honolulu's Elderly Affairs Division</u>, <u>Aloha United Way</u> and <u>St Francis Healthcare System</u> to establish a dedicated hotline for this purpose.

"AUW's 2-1-1 helpline is a natural fit for this effort because we already provide essential information to Hawai'i residents of all ages who need local resources like medical care, food banks, legal assistance, and more," said AUW's Lisa Kimura. "We also have language translation services on stand-by so that language is not a barrier for those who call."

"The process that we have developed is scalable and has allowed us to ramp up to be ready to serve the large number of those who are 65 years and above," said Melissa Ah Ho-Mauga of St. Francis Healthcare System. "It's a great feeling to be working on this as a team to continually improve the way we serve Kupuna."

While the Kupuna hotline is currently available only on Oahu, officials are hopeful to expand the service to other islands as more volunteers get trained. If you or someone you know needs help setting up a vaccine appointment, please call the 2-1-1 hotline anytime between 7am and 10pm seven days a week.

10 THINGS THE FULLY VACCINATED NEED TO KNOW (From AARP Health News)

- 1. You still need to wear a mask. The coronavirus is still circulating and more contagious variants have emerged.
- 2. You could still catch COVID-19. This is the other reason experts don't want you to put aside your mask.
- 3. You could infect someone else. There's a small chance you could get infected and not even realize it.
- 4. You can visit friends and family. Those fully vaccinated can gather **indoors** with others who are also fully vaccinated without wearing masks or social distancing. May also spend time **inside** with unvaccinated people from a single household without wearing masks or physical distancing as long as no one is at increased risk for severe COVID-19 disease and no one lives with somebody who's at increased risk as well.
- 5. You don't have to quarantine after exposure; however, if you develop COVID-19 symptoms, get tested!
- 6. You should keep your vaccine record card handy.
- 7. Travel is still discouraged.
- 8. It's a good time to go to the doctor or dentist.
- 9. You may need a booster shot. If our immunity wears off naturally or if the virus changes so much that the immunity we have from the current vaccines proves inadequate.
- 10. A return to normal hinges on herd immunity.
