SUNDAY REFLECTION

Aloha my brothers and sisters. I hope you live forever! [Resp: I am on His (Jesus’) way!]

Lent is over, Jesus has ascended, and we are now waiting for His triumphant return...Parousia.

This weekend is Divine Mercy Sunday. Pope John Paul II, now Saint John Paul II, designated the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday on April 30, 2000. This is the same day Sister Faustina Kowalska was made a Saint. She was born in 1905 in the village of Glogowiec, Poland. At seven years of age, she recognized the Holy Spirit, and how dear Jesus was in her life. A life that was cut too short by tuberculosis at the age of 33. This awareness of Jesus grew into a special trust with the Divine Master. In her heart she longed to belong to a religious order to serve God. In 1924 she left her home to go to Warsaw, the capital of Poland, because she heard a voice telling her she would join a

convent there. In 1925 she was accepted into the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy.

She spent much of her time with strangers while away from home. Unlike other young woman of her generation, she believed and trusted God. Her acceptance of his will and her attitude toward his trust are not unlike God fearing, holy people found throughout sacred Scripture, such as Abraham, Jacob, Noah, and Joseph to name a few.

In the 1930’s Jesus asked St. Faustina to promote his divine mercy to a world that was placing its trust in others or themselves instead of God. Sister wrote, “Jesus recognized that to renew in people the love of God they need to recognize their need for his mercy.” What sustained St. Faustina in troubled times was her uncompromising trust in Jesus and his unlimited mercy. This same trust we pray every time we say the Diocese of Honolulu Covid -19 prayer. Like St. Faustina, we too live in a time where people rely on technology and self, more than God. We Catholic Christians need to be the voice that counters this, by loudly proclaiming, “Jesus I put my trust in you and your Divine Mercy!”

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

APRIL 11, 2021

My Lord and My God! (John 20:28)

(From a homily by Pope Francis for Divine Mercy Sunday, April 7, 2013)

“In today’s Gospel, the apostle Thomas personally experiences the mercy of God, which has a concrete face, the face of Jesus, the risen Jesus. Thomas does not believe it when the other apostles tell him, ‘We have seen the Lord’ (John 20:25). It isn’t enough for him that Jesus had foretold it...He wants to see; he wants to put his hand in the place of the nails and in Jesus’ side.

“And how does Jesus react? With patience: Jesus does not abandon Thomas in his stubborn unbelief; he gives him a week’s time, he does not close the door, he waits. And Thomas acknowledges his own poverty, his little faith.

“My Lord and my God! (John 20:28). With this simple yet faith-filled invocation, he responds to Jesus’ patience. He lets himself be enveloped by divine mercy; he sees it before his eyes, the wounds of Christ’s hands and feet and in his open side, and he discovers trust; he is a new man, no longer an unbeliever, but a believer....

“Maybe someone among us here is thinking: my sin is so great, I am as far from God as the younger son in the parable, my unbelief is like that of Thomas; I don’t have the courage to go back, to believe that God can welcome me and that he is waiting for me, of all people. But God is indeed waiting for you; he asks of you only the courage to go to him....

“Let us find the courage to return to his house, to dwell in his loving wounds, allowing ourselves to be loved by him and to encounter his mercy in the sacraments. We feel his wonderful tenderness, we will feel his embrace, and we too will become more capable of mercy, patience, forgiveness and love.” *“My Lord and my God! Thank you for your unending mercy!”*
