SUNDAY REFLECTION



Building the Domestic Church By: Joshua Kapika

Sharing the gospel with others is often the hardest thing to do, but sharing it with our families or even in our homes can be ten times harder than talking to a stranger about your beliefs.

In today's Gospel, Jesus returns to his homeland and is teaching in the synagogue when many of those who were gathered were astounded yet offended by his teachings. They were offended because they knew who Jesus was and could not believe such wisdom could come from a carpenter.

Sharing the faith at home is hard, but it's not impossible. Even Jesus was able to heal a few people while there and who is to say that he could not have done more. The obstacle we face when sharing Christ with others is our personal history. Our personal history can often be a difficult thing to overcome. Many of those Jesus tried to heal did not have faith that Jesus could in fact heal them. As we learned in last week's Gospel, sometimes all we need is just a little faith.

It takes the same kind of faith for those in our family or even our friends to begin to believe in what

we offer when sharing the good news of Christ. If we grew up rarely attending Church or barely praying for our food, it will be quite the hard sell to get people to trust what you now know to be true and life changing. Now we can either choose to accept that and move on or we can make an attempt to stick it out and actually make a difference in the lives of those we care about.

Building the domestic Church is so vital in today's society. So many people have allowed for society to lead and guide their thoughts instead of allowing Christ and the Holy Spirit to guide them. If we as parents, godparents, grandparents and even aunts and uncles can make an effort to live more fully the life of Christ, then we can begin to see a revitalization of the Church.

I believe Christ would have wanted to spend more time on teaching the people of his hometown, but he also knew there was not enough time to waste. We have the time and energy to truly make a difference in the home. Let us not rely on society or the world to raise our children or affect our families, let us turn to the Church and most especially to Christ to help us build our domestic Church at home. For faith is best nurtured in the home.

SHOULD I GO TO OCIA?

(Order Of Christian Initiation for Adults)

Adults who desire the Sacrament of Baptism, those who were baptized in another Christian tradition and who desire to become Catholic, and those who were baptized Catholic but never received Confirmation, are invited to participate in the **OCIA** classes, formerly known as **RCIA**.
