a wooden box in which the tablets of the Ten Commandments were kept
- Beatitudes** (p. 250)
teachings of Jesus that describe the way to live as his disciples
- Bible** (p. 25)
the written record of God's Revelation and his relationship with his people
- blasphemy** (p. 191)
a thought, word, or act that refers to God without respect or reverence
- Blessed Trinity** (p. 23)
the Three Persons in One God: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit
- Book of Genesis** (p. 33)
the first book in the Bible
- Canaan** (p. 69)
an area in western Palestine that included most of present-day Israel
- Catholic social teaching** (p. 291)
the teaching of the Church that calls all members to work for justice and peace as Jesus did
- conscience** (p. 39)
the ability to know the difference between good and evil, right and wrong
- covenant** (p. 33)
an agreement between God and his people
- Divine Inspiration** (p. 25)
the special guidance that the Holy Spirit gave to the human writers of the Bible
- Divine Revelation** (p. 23)
God's making himself known to us
- ecumenism** (p. 297)
the work to promote unity among all Christians
- exodus** (p. 98)
the biblical word describing the Israelites' departure from slavery to freedom
- faith** (p. 69)
a gift from God that enables us to believe in him and accept all that he has revealed
- free will** (p. 39)
the freedom and ability to choose
- Gospel** (p. 57)
the Good News about God at work in Jesus Christ
- holiness** (p. 298)
sharing in God's goodness and responding to his love by the way we live; our holiness comes through grace
- hope** (p. 199)
a gift from God that enables us to trust in God's promise to be with us always; it enables us to be confident in God's love and care for us
- human dignity** (p. 39)
the value and worth that comes from being made in God's image and likeness
- idolatry** (p. 173)
giving worship to a creature or thing instead of to God
- Incarnation** (p. 225)
the truth that the Son of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, became man
- Kingdom of God** (p. 248)
the power of God's love coming into the world and into our lives
- lamentation** (p. 196)
a sorrow that is expressed in the form of a poem
- Last Supper** (p. 260)
the Passover meal that Jesus shared with his disciples on the night before he died
- manna** (p. 109)
a sweet bread-like food that God provided for the Israelites in the desert
- marks of the Church** (p. 297)
the four essential features of the Church: one, holy, catholic, and apostolic

- martyr** (p. 277)
person who dies rather than give up his or her belief in Jesus Christ
- miracle** (p. 109)
an extraordinary event that is beyond human power and brought about by God
- monarchy** (p. 134)
kingdom or empire ruled by one person, either a king or queen
- Mount Sinai** (p. 109)
a mountain peak in the rocky southern part of the Sinai peninsula
- Nazirite** (p. 125)
a person consecrated to God who promised not to drink wine or strong drink, touch anyone or anything that had died, or cut or shave his or her hair
- Original Sin** (p. 50)
the first sin that weakened human nature and brought ignorance, suffering, and death into the world; we all suffer from its effects
- parable** (p. 211)
short story that has a message
- Passover** (p. 103)
the event in which God passed over the whole of Egypt, taking the lives of every firstborn Egyptian and sparing the Israelites
- patriarch** (p. 69)
a father, or founder, of a clan, a group of related families
- Pentecost** (p. 273)
the day on which the Holy Spirit came upon the first disciples
- pharaoh** (p. 75)
the king of Egypt
- prophet** (p. 132)
someone who speaks on behalf of God, defends the truth, and works for justice
- proverb** (p. 200)
a brief saying that gives wise advice
- providence** (p. 75)
God's plan for and protection of all creation
- psalm** (p. 150)
a poetic prayer designed to be sung or chanted to some kind of musical accompaniment
- Resurrection** (p. 265)
the mystery of Jesus' being raised from the dead
- sin** (p. 50)
a thought, word, deed, or omission against God's law
- soul** (p. 45)
the invisible spiritual reality that makes each of us human and that will never die
- steward** (p. 47)
a person who is given both the authority over what he or she cares for and the responsibility for seeing that it lives and grows
- superstition** (p. 196)
the false belief that living creatures or things possess powers that in fact they do not have
- Ten Commandments** (p. 111)
the laws of God's covenant given to Moses on Mount Sinai
- Torah** (p. 203)
the Hebrew name for the first five books of the Old Testament
- Tradition** (p. 25)
the Revelation of the Good News of Jesus Christ as lived out in the Church, past and present
- vocation** (p. 191)
God's call to serve him in a special way
- wisdom** (p. 147)
the knowledge and ability to recognize and follow God's will in our lives
