As the largest island offshore of California, there is great diversity in the geology and topography, starting at the cobblestone beach, moving up to wave cut terraces, and continuing on to mountainous peaks. Besides the beautiful vistas that overlook the Santa Barbara Channel and all its rich marine diversity, the island is host to a very unique habitat of plants and animals found nowhere else in the world. It is somewhat common to see the endemic Santa Cruz Island Fox along the trails at Scorpion.</p> <p>Lunch Included on day tour.
