### ST. BARTHOLOMEW/ ST. MARY'S CEMETERIES

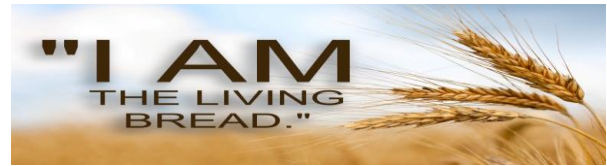
