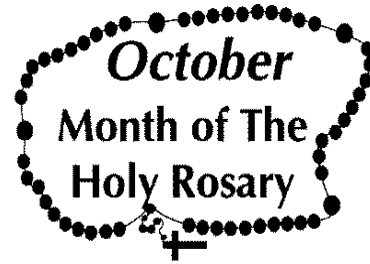

A Letter from Archbishop Aymond



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Mission Sunday will be celebrated throughout the world on October 18.

We remember the words of Jesus. "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the ages." Mk 28:19-20

For most of us, the command to go forth to a foreign land is all but impossible. But we can fulfill this call here at home. Jesus calls us to keep our hearts open to the missions where our brothers and sisters face many challenges. The poverty and lack of infrastructures make their challenges almost insurmountable. Many dioceses and religious orders depend upon Mission Sunday to continue their missionary work. Many hunger for a deeper relationship with Jesus and many are persecuted because of their faith in him and the Church.

As we know, the coronavirus has affected the world—certainly the mission lands. This gives them additional challenges. May we open our hearts to hear again the invitation of Jesus to go forth "to the ends of the earth" through our prayers, sacrifice and financial support.

Pope Francis said, "The celebration of world Mission Day is also an occasion for reaffirming how prayer, reflection and the material help of our offerings are opportunities to participate actively in the mission of Jesus in his Church".
