If you would like to donate palms for Palm Sunday, please bring your **washed** palms to the front door of Church beginning **Monday, March 22**.

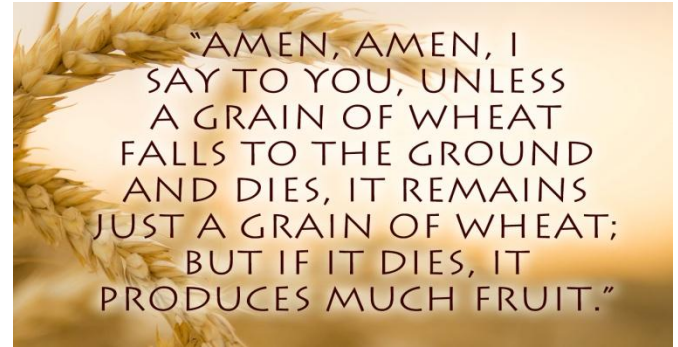

**A Stewardship Moment:** Fifth Sunday of Lent Proclaimed this weekend is the Gospel story of Jesus inviting his disciples into a great mystery with curious pronouncements: Those who love their lives just as they are will lose them.
