### STEWARDSHIP MOMENTS

In today's second reading, St. Paul teaches the community at Corinth about a spirituality of giving. He urges them to give and helps them understand that through their generosity, they will in turn be recipients of a spiritual abundance. They will receive from those who are beneficiaries of their own giving a reciprocal gift that amounts to an equality of giving that deepens their relationship with Christ Jesus. A good reflection this week would be to think of the ways your own life has been enriched by your generosity. How might you have reaped a spiritual abundance through your own generous behavior?

### Hurricane Season Preparedness Tips:

- If the Emergency Management Office recommends evacuating, take their advice.
- Take time and think, get all necessary insurance papers, identification including driver's license, social security cards, proof of residence, wills, birth and marriage certificates, tax records, special photographs and videos, cell phone and charger, cash, medication/prescriptions and medical supplies, keys, maps, flashlight, computer, other items important to you, a weather radio, clothing, first aid kit, blankets, pillow, sleeping bags, and bring pets to safety.
- Be prepared-study, watch and listen.
- Empty Refrigerator and take the food you can, throw the rest in the garbage can.
- Shut off gas, electricity (the A/C unit and other electrical items as many as possible.)
- Secure doors and garage from inside.
- Leave a note, a telephone call, text, or email to your family when you have evacuated and where you are going.
- Fill your vehicle with gasoline, purchase drinking bottle water, canned food/can opener, paper plates etc.
- Listen to the radio; check your smart phone or computer for the latest news.
