## Clergy Corner - Faithful at Shrine in Lourdes

Dear Holy People of God,

Have you ever seen the movie, "Song of Bernadette". Peggy and I watched it again just before we left for a 3-week trip to France. The first 5 days of our trip we spent in Lourdes at a study conference of the International Diaconate Centre, which was a gathering of deacons from 30 countries on 5 continents around the world. The theme of the conference was appropriately "The Deacon and Healing", which took place on the grounds of this beloved Shrine. Spending 5 days at the Shrine, where in 1858, the Blessed Mother appeared to a simple 14-year-old girl, Bernadette Soubirous, and announced herself to be the "Immaculate Conception" (patroness of 1 of our parishes) was a true inspiration to say the least.

How can I describe the faith of the tens of thousands who flocked there every day, where there were several masses in many languages going on from way before dawn till way late into the night at 4 churches and the shrine itself on those grounds? And what about the moving nightly candlelight procession with thousands of faithful reciting the Rosary in every conceivable language with hundreds of people in wheelchairs coming to pray at the Shrine and drink or bathe in the waters that miraculously appeared when Bernadette scratched the ground where Mary appeared. And then the closing mass of our conference was held in the subterranean Basilica of St. Pius X with over 25,000 people in attendance.

What I experienced was a profound display of faith by a people who had a great devotion to Mary; it brought home to me how important Mary is to us as Catholics. We honor her, venerate her, reverence her, but we do not worship her. We only worship God. I was reminded that Mary is conceived without sin and in the fullness of grace, as the Church was. She is a faithful and undefiled Virgin, as the Church is called to be. Mary is redeemed by Christ, as the Church is. She is the sign of God's presence among us, as the Church is. She is transformed and renewed by God's presence, as the Church is. Mary shared fully in the resurrection of Christ as the Church is destined to do. And she intercedes for us pilgrims, as the Church does. And this is why we call Mary the Perfect Disciple and the Mother of the Church.
