Treasures from Our Tradition

How long have there been parochial schools in the United States? Longer than you may imagine. Saint Mary School in Philadelphia was started by the Jesuits in 1782. Parochial schools require considerable sacrifice, but they endure as a distinctive treasure of the Church in the United States. In Ireland the Church is authorized to run national schools, sometimes under sponsorship of a parish. In Quebec publicly-funded "separate schools" were administered by the Church until 1998 when the state reorganized schools along linguistic lines. Wherever the state funds Catholic schools, normally enrollment is guaranteed to all applicants.
