## Angel Tree Program

The Angel Tree Program for 2020 is underway!

The Program is a local Austin County organization formed and staffed entirely by volunteers from Immaculate Conception Church and Industry United Methodist Church, with the assistance from ISB-New Ulm Branch. The purpose of this organization is to distribute Christmas gifts to low-income families with children under the age of 15, who live in the West End area of Austin County and whose children attend school in Bellville ISD. The program also services families in need that are active members of any of the participating Angel Tree parishes. This is not a government subsidized program. We rely completely upon donations and gifts from individuals within the Community. Your help and contributions continue to be critical.



Last year, the Angel Tree program, provided gifts to 29 families and 65 children in our area. For many of our registered children, the gifts they receive through the Angel Tree Program are the only ones they open on Christmas morning.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, there is a significant change in the Angel Tree Program. Normally, interviews are held during the October WECCO distribution. If the application is accepted an angel tag is generated for each child. The Angel tags are then distributed between Immaculate Conception Church, Industry United Methodist Church and ISB-New Ulm branch, giving the public the opportunity to select a tag and purchase the requested gifts for that child.

This year we are not doing face-to-face interviews nor asking for gifts. Instead we are requesting gift cards. Applications will be provided to individuals who have accepted assistance from WECCO. Upon receipt, the applications will be reviewed by our volunteers and qualified families will be contacted by phone. Our ultimate goal is for each child to receive a gift card for \$50 and each family to receive a \$100 gift card for groceries. Tags will be set up at each participating location where sponsors will be given the opportunity to: make a monetary donation that will go towards purchasing gifts cards, donate gift card in increments ranging from \$25 to \$50, or donate \$100 gift card for each family. The gift cards should be from Wal-Mart, HEB and/or Target.

Through the Angel Tree Program, sponsors can give joy to a child and a family in need during the holiday season. Gift cards or monetary donations need to be received by December 13, 2020.

## Seeking Happiness Is Seeking Jesus

Pope John Paul II said, "It is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you; He is the beauty to which you are so attracted; it is He who provoked you with that thirst for fullness that will not let you settle for compromise; it is He who urges you to shed the masks of a false life; it is He who reads in your heart your most genuine choices, the choices that others try to stifle.

## The Second Coming of Christ

The two New Testament readings for this Sunday, Paul's pastoral letter to the Thessalonians and Jesus' parable of the ten virgins, both take up the theme of the Second Coming of Christ. The parable, found only in Matthew, reflects his tendency to identify Jesus with divine Wisdom, which is personified as a woman in today's first reading. What is being urged upon Jesus' followers is the necessity of keeping vigil, watching at dawn for Wisdom, "resplendent and unfading," the glorified and risen Lord, graciously to appear.



What it means to live now in the hope of Jesus' coming again in glory is Paul's concern in 1 Thessalonians. For these early Christians expecting Jesus' imminent return, the death of one of their members raises a troubling question: Will the dead also share in the glory of the risen Lord? Paul's answer is a firm yes "on the word of the Lord." Having this hope, he says they should not grieve "like the rest who have no hope." This is not to say that Christians do not grieve, but that their grief is, in some sense, contained by the sure hope that God, who raised Jesus from the dead, will raise the dead with Jesus.

## Treasures from Our Tradition

For several weeks, we have considered penance as a sacrament of forgiveness, and yet there are two other sacraments in this category. The first, of course, is the Eucharist itself. The other is the sacrament of the sick, long associated with penance.

The Letter of James sets out the deep tradition for caring for the sick: sending for the priests, who will pray and lay their hands on the sick ones, anointing them with oil, and giving them forgiveness. Long before other rites of penance developed, the sacrament of the sick was therefore a profound experience of forgiveness. Jesus often healed the sick, nearly always as a visible sign of forgiveness of sin. The tradition didn't unfold smoothly, however, and within a few centuries the oil of the sick was taken home to be applied by caregivers as a salve, or even to be drunk as a medicine. As early as the second century, bishops were therefore urging that priests should be the ones to visit those separated by illness from the Sunday assembly. Thus the practice of consigning the Eucharist and the oil of the sick to the non-ordained faithful to bring home was relatively short-lived.
