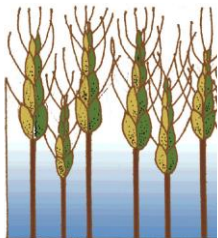

Finding Serenity and Joy

Curiously enough, it is a fear of how grace will change and improve them that keeps many souls away from God. They want God to take them as they are and let them stay that way. They want Him to take away their love of riches, but not their riches—to purge them of the disgust of sin, but not of the pleasure of sin. Some of them equate goodness with indifference to evil and think that God is good if He is broad-minded or tolerant about evil.

Like the onlookers at the Cross, they want God on their terms, not His, and they shout, "Come down, and we will believe." But the things they ask are the marks of a false religion: it promises salvation without a cross, abandonment without sacrifice, Christ without his nails.

God is a consuming fire; our desire for God must include a willingness to have the chaff burned from our intellect and the weeds of our sinful will purged. The very fear souls have of surrendering themselves to the Lord with a cross is an evidence of their instinctive belief in His Holiness. Because God is fire, we cannot escape Him, whether we draw near for conversion or flee from aversion: in either case, He affects us. If we accept His love, its fires will illumine and warm us; if we reject Him, they will still burn on in us in frustration and remorse.

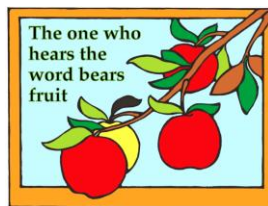
Online Giving for the Parishes Now Available

Giving of Oneself

Scientists have recently begun to discuss the idea that the primary force behind all life in the universe is self-gift. This is how everything from galaxies to human babies are born and sustained.

If we read the opening of today's passage from Isaiah correctly, we see that he anticipated twentieth-century scientists by over twenty five hundred years. Using the self-giving example of the rain and snow clouds that water the



earth that then yields fruit, which in turn is given over to nourish creatures, Isaiah leads us to understand that the primary force behind all life is the word of God.

The ultimate giving of that word, we believe, was Jesus Christ, who, in the greatest revelation of divine love, gave of himself on the cross.

To what degree are we in touch with that self-giving God in whose image we are made? To what extent do we really follow the self-giving example of Christ into whose death and resurrection we were baptized, whose ultimate self-gift we celebrate every week in the Eucharist? With God's help, our lives can be like Isaiah's rain and snow, and we will not return to heaven until we have done our part to make the earth fruitful.

Trust In the Spirit and Bear Fruit

In Romans Chapter 8, Paul boldly declares his faith in the future: "I consider that the sufferings of the present time are as nothing compared to the glory to be revealed for us," he says. How can he be so confident? Because he trusts absolutely in the firstfruits that the Spirit, that seed of fire, has already produced, namely, the resurrection of Jesus in which we and all creation can hope to share. Jesus' parable is also a confident assertion about the future of the Gospel which, borrowing from the language of Isaiah, he likens to seed. As the word of God in Isaiah will surely achieve the end for which it was sent, so will the good news of Jesus, against all odds, produce an abundant harvest.

A subtle shift takes place in the focus and the intended audience of the explanation of Jesus' parable. The focus moves from the seed to the soil that receives it, and the hearers are no longer the crowd but the disciples of Jesus. What this does is draw us, who consider ourselves disciples, into the line of fire. Jesus asks us now, as he asked his inner circle then, to test the quality of the soil we bring to the hearing of the Gospel.
