Make time to attend this special devotion with your family every week during the Season of Lent.</p>	<p>Note: Feb. 17 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday is a day of Fast and Abstinence, no meat is to be eaten and meals should be small. A strict Fast would be bread and water only.</p>	<p>If you are on medications, you probably should not do a strict Fast. Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. No meat is to be eaten unless it is necessary due to medical reasons.</p>	<p>Some other saints: 14th - Sts. Cyril & Methodius - Sv. Valentin 17th - The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order 21st - St. Peter Damian 28th - Sv. Roman 29th - Sv.
