For the month of May, we continue our reflections for the Year of the Domestic Church by celebrating the gift of parenthood. By looking **CHURCH**



to Christ and his relationship with God the Father, we see the beauty of reciprocity in relationships between parents and children. This month as we celebrate the gift of parents, let us celebrate the gift of the people who brought us into this world, as well as the gift of a loving father in heaven.

NATIONAL FOSTER CARE MONTH: You may be called to be more active in the support of foster children and their families. With the appropriate training and screening, you can play an important role in nurturing these children who have many challenges before them. Some examples of how you can help include:

- 1. Hosting celebrations: picnics, holiday gatherings, birthday parties, etc.
- 2. Academic tutoring
- 3. Mentoring/apprenticeships/"career days" for children aging out of foster care
- 4. Respite care for foster/adoptive parents
- 5. Counseling/parenting courses
- 6. Addiction recovery support
- 7. Retreats and days of reflection/renewal
- 8. Legal services for children, families of origin, foster and adoptive parents
- 9. CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) trains and supports people who stand up for the best interests of children who have been abused or neglected. Appointed by judges, they speak up for the child's needs in the courtroom and community.

Open Table, a national coalition, provides a means for faith-based communities to engage groups of volunteers that make a year-long commitment to act - through relationship — as a team of life specialists, encouragers, and advocates. Texas' First Lady is recommending using the Open Table process to assist children who are aging out of the system.

The Ascension of the Lord

The Feast of the Ascension celebrates the day on which the risen Christ, in the sight of His apostles, ascended bodily into Heaven. It is a moveable feast day, always occurring 40 days after Easter, which, in 2021, would be May 13. However, in many

archdioceses (including ours), the observance of this Holy Day of Obligation occurs on the following Sunday.

The period from Ascension Thursday through Pentecost Sunday represents the final stretch of the Easter season. Many Catholics prepare for Pentecost by praying the Novena to the Holy Ghost, in which we ask for the gifts of the Holy Spirit. It is traditionally prayed beginning on the Friday after Ascension Thursday and ending on the day before Pentecost Sunday to commemorate the original novena—the nine days that the apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary spent in prayer after Christ's Ascension and before the descent of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

O Lord, we thank you for allowing us to celebrate this feast which reminds us of your going before us to heaven.

We long to join you in the gift of everlasting life which you gained for us in your self-giving death and resurrection.

Allow us to serve your people until the day when we celebrate together the joy of your Kingdom, where you live and reign forever and ever.

Amen.

A Note from the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This year Pope Francis dedicated the Church to St. Joseph. In the Gospels, he doesn't speak one word, yet two thousand years later the entire world knows his name and looks to him for inspiration. St Joseph and the Holy family are the model for every man and every family. St. Joseph did whatever God commanded him to do and his life echoes Psalm 112:1-6: "Blessed is the man who fears the Lord, who greatly delights in his commandments! His descendants will be mighty in the Land; the generation of the upright will be blessed... For the righteous will never be moved; he will be remembered forever." Without God in our lives it is impossible to live the Christian model of marriage, however with God all things are possible. In the Vatican II documents, Pope John Paul II stated that "the home is the domestic church because Christ is present in husband and wife where the two become one."

Christ is truly present within your home. St. John Paul II stated in his letter to Families, that "the family is placed at the heart of the great struggle between good and evil, between life and death, between love and all that is opposed to love." The future of the world and of the Church passes through the family. In 1994 St. John Paul II stated that he was to endure the suffering for the sake of the family: "I understood that I must lead Christ's Church into this third millennium through suffering ... Precisely because the family is threatened, the family is under attack. The Pope has to be attacked, the Pope has to suffer, so that every family and the world may see that there is ... a higher Gospel ... by which the future is prepared, the third millennium of families."

Throughout the month of May, let us daily pray the Rosary together as a family; may we look to Mary and St. Joseph to find strength to lead the domestic church (the family) into a relationship with the God who created and loves us. May the Holy Spirit fill your homes with his presence. **Fr. Steve**
