

Student Expectations for Virtual Schooling

- Students will need to pick up the required materials at St. Eugene School. It will be the responsibility of the student to keep all materials in a safe space to avoid losing or damaging the materials.
- Students must turn in assignments by the due date given by their classroom teacher. This may require a drop off of materials to the school building or a virtual turn in on Google Classroom, depending on the assignment. If assignments are not turned in on time, points will be deducted.
- Students will live stream into their classrooms daily. Assigned times will be given by their individual classroom teacher.
- Students should make sure their devices are fully charged or a charger is accessible so as not to lose valuable time during the live stream time period.
- Students should remain at a table or desk during a live stream for that class period. Students should ask the instructor's permission to leave the computer, such as to use the restroom.
- Students should have their materials organized for easy access during the class period. This includes but is not limited to pencils, pens, markers, crayons, loose-leaf paper, glue, scissors, construction paper, copybooks/journals, workbooks, and textbooks.
- Students are expected to follow along and participate in lessons.
- Students are expected to follow the same classroom rules and expectations as students who are receiving in-person instruction. This includes following all expectations in our Acceptable Use Policy.
- Students should not be eating while participating in live stream instruction.
- Students should be dressed in their school uniform.
- Students should keep the camera on and be visible at all times during the live stream. The microphone should remain off unless the student has a question for the teacher.
- Students are not permitted to use the chat feature in Google Meet. If a question should arise, they may ask the teacher by turning on their microphone and raising their hand.
- Students should not have the television or radio on during the live streaming time period to avoid any distractions.
- Students should not be on their cellphones during the live stream period to avoid any distractions.
- Students should not be interacting with family members, including siblings or pets, during the live stream class periods.
- Students are required to complete their own work.
- Students should seek help by contacting their classroom teacher when needed or should they begin to feel overwhelmed.
- Interruptions during live stream lessons from parents or students are discouraged. Should a problem arise, parents and/or students should contact the teacher via email or a phone call.
- It is highly recommended that students have access to a printer as it may be needed throughout their virtual learning experience.
